THE HAWKS

→ **Lamarr Kimble** tied his career-high with 31 points, including 24 in the second half, to help SJU rally to an 89-75 win over UIC on Wednesday night. **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, scored 19 points and **Jared Bynum** had a season-high 17. **Pierfrancesco Oliva** grabbed 13 rebounds in the win, which snapped a three-game losing streak

→ Saint Joseph's ranks second in the nation in fewest turnovers per game, with an average of 8.0. Virginia is the leader with 7.1 turnovers per game

→ The Hawks lead the A-10 in three-point percentage, converting 40.2 percent, and hold the top three individual spots with **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, **Jared Bynum** and **Taylor Funk**

→ **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, is the leading scorer in the A-10 with 24.1 points per game and ranks 14th in the nation.

→ Freshman **Jared Bynum** ranks sixth in the NCAA stats in assist/turnover ratio as he has 24 assists to just four turnovers on the year

→ This is the Big 5 opener for SJU, and the remainder of their city games are spread out. The Hawks play Villanova on Dec. 8, Penn on Jan. 26 and La Salle on Feb. 5

→ Up next for Saint Joseph's is a meeting at Princeton on Wednesday and one with rival Villanova next Saturday, December 8

• Temple has won two in row vs. the Hawks, including a 78-72 decision here in Hagan Arena two years ago
 • Saint Joseph's is 3-1 vs. Temple in Hagan Arena
 • The Owls edged the Hawks last season, 81-78, at the Liacouras Center. SJU rallied from a 16-point deficit in the second half but couldn't get over the hump. Shavar Newkirk led Saint Joseph's with 18 points while **Chris Clover** had a career-high 17 points and nine rebounds

LAST TIME OUT

• **Lamarr Kimble** scored 24 of his career-high tying 31 points in the second half, as Saint Joseph's rallied from a 13-point deficit to defeat UIC, 89-75, at Hagan Arena. The win snapped SJU's three-game losing streak
 • **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, finished with 19 points while **Jared Bynum** hit for a season-high 17 points. **Pierfrancesco Oliva** had 13 rebounds for his fourth game in double figures, while he added two blocks and three steals
 • The Hawks trailed, 55-42, with 15:39 to play in the second half, but three-pointers from **Taylor Funk** and Kimble started a 12-0 run. Saint Joseph's would outscore the Flames, 18-2, during the six-minute stretch, led by 13 from Kimble, to take its first lead of the half, 60-57, with 9:50 to play
 • UIC tied the game three more times, but Saint Joseph's sealed the victory with a 16-3 run as the Flames missed five shots in a row. A deep three-pointer by Funk put SJU up 79-68 at 2:35 and Bynum made two free throws to give SJU an 81-68 lead with 2:16 remaining

FRESH APPROACH

• **Lamarr "Fresh" Kimble** keyed the Hawks' rally from 13 points down against UIC as SJU recorded the 89-75 win
 • It was his second 31-point effort in three games, as he previously set his career-high against West Virginia on November 18
 • Kimble scored 24 points in the second half, which is highest single-half total for a Hawk this season. **Charlie Brown** scored 23 of his 37 points vs. William & Mary in the first half
 • Kimble is now averaging a career-best 18.3 points per game and is the Hawks' leader in free throw percentage with 84.6 percent

LONG-RUNNING SHOW

• This marks the 161st game in the Saint Joseph's-Temple series, which is the longest running series for the Hawks and the most-played in Big 5 history
 • When the teams met on Dec. 4, 2013, it was the first time in 67 years that Saint Joseph's and Temple met in a non-conference game
 • Both schools were members of the Middle Athletic Conference from 1946-47 to 1973-74 and then joined the East Coast Conference
 • After the 1981-82 season, Saint Joseph's and Temple became members of the Atlantic 10, with TU moving to the American Athletic Conference for play beginning in 2013-14
 • There have been 30 non-conference games played in the series, with Temple holding a 17-14 edge
 • SJU played most of its home games with Temple at the Palestra until the 2011-12 season when it brought the game to the newly-renovated Hagan Arena

FRIENDLY FOES

• This marks the 39th game that good friends **Phil Martelli** and Fran Dunphy will coach against each other. They met 17 times when Dunphy coached at Penn, and this is the 22nd meeting between Saint Joseph's and Temple with the coaches on the sidelines
 • The duo also share a passion for their work in the community, serving as co-chairs of the Philadelphia Coaches vs. Cancer effort, which is one of the nation's highest fundraising groups for Coaches vs. Cancer
 • The group, which is comprised of the city's six Division I coaches and their wives, has raised over \$14 million

KEY TO THE CITY

• This is the first Big 5 game of the season for SJU. The Hawks went 1-3 in the City Series last year
 • Saint Joseph's has won 20 Big 5 titles (9 outright/11 shared), which is behind Temple's 27 titles (6/21 shared) and Villanova's 26 (15 outright/11 shared)

WHAT BROWN CAN DO FOR YOU

• **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, established a new career-high for the third time this year as he poured in 37 points at William & Mary
 • He scored 23 in the first half, the highest single-half total of his career, hitting 11-of-17 from the field and 11-of-14 from the foul line
 • His 37 points are the third most in the history of Kaplan Arena and tied the seventh highest single-game scoring total in Saint Joseph's history

THREES ALL AROUND

- The Hawks have the top three long-range shooters in the Atlantic 10 as **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, leads the league in three-point percentage (53.7), **Jared Bynum** is second (47.6) and **Taylor Funk** is tied for third (47.4)
- Brown ranks second in the A-10 in three-point field goals made per game (3.1) while Funk is fourth (2.6)
- SJU has made 72 threes, the 29th highest total in the NCAA

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

- The Hawks are ranked second in the nation in turnovers per game (8.1) and are eighth in fewest number of turnovers with 56
- SJU has committed less than 11 turnovers in every game this season, with a low of six vs. Monmouth
- Freshman **Jared Bynum** leads the A-10 in assist/turnover ratio with 6.0 and is ranked sixth in the nation. He has 24 assists this year to just four turnovers

TAYLOR'S THREE'S

- Sophomore **Taylor Funk** now has 102 three-pointers in the 39 games of his career thus far, which is the quickest to 100 of any Hawk. By comparison, all-time leader Langston Galloway made 75 threes in his first 37 games
- Funk set the SJU freshman record last season when he made 84 in 32 games
- He hit a career-best 6-for-7 from beyond the arc in the win over Wake Forest

20/20

- **Charlie Brown, Jr.** has tallied 20-plus points in five of seven games this season; he now has six games of 20 points or more in 38 career games

ON BOARD

- **Pierfrancesco Oliva** is the Hawks' leading rebounder with 8.7 per game
- He has grabbed double-figure rebounds in four of seven games, including the last two at William & Mary (12) and vs. UIC (13)
- Oliva posted the first double-double of his career in the opener vs. ODU (17 pts, 14 reb)

SHARP SHOOTERS

- The Hawks have shot 50 percent or better in five of 14 halves played this year, with a high of 58.6 percent in the second half of the Monmouth win

HANDOUTS

- Saint Joseph's showed great ball movement against Wake Forest and got everyone involved as the Hawks had 20 assists on 32 baskets

RALLY TOWELS

- SJU trailed by 13 points in the second half against UIC on Wednesday, but rallied to post an 89-75 win; it was the largest deficit overcome for victory thus far this season

CHECK IT OUT

- **Pierfrancesco "Checco" Oliva** had a stellar season debut, coming off the bench to record the first double-double of his career against ODU

- The redshirt junior had 17 points and 14 rebounds, while shooting 6-of-9 from the field

- **Phil Martelli** said that although he doesn't like labels, "Oliva is the epitome of a point-forward". The coach also revealed that Oliva deferred his starting role to sophomore **Anthony Longpré**

YOU'RE A GOOD MAN, CHARLIE BROWN

- **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, was named the Atlantic 10 Player of the Week for Nov. 19, marking the first time he has earned the league's weekly honor as an upperclassman; he was also chosen as the Big 5 Co-Player of the Week

- He averaged 23.3 points in four games, shooting 58.5 percent from the field and 54.2 percent from three-point range (18-for-22)

CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

- Redshirt junior **Lamarr "Fresh" Kimble** was voted team captain for the third consecutive season, becoming the only player in SJU history to serve as captain for three years

- As a sophomore, Kimble became just the third player in Hawk history to be named a captain in his second season

- Kimble's leadership is appreciated by **Phil Martelli**: "I'm glad he's on my team and I'm glad he's in my program because whatever I need... He's in charge of that locker room... Fresh is just legit. He's one of those guys that embraces being a Philadelphian and playing in Philadelphia.... I'm a big Fresh fan, forget the basketball. He is the epitome of a captain."

LOOK AT LORENZO

- **Phil Martelli** stated in the preseason that redshirt sophomore **Lorenzo Edwards** was one player who had made the biggest strides over the summer

- Edwards gave a glimpse of that improvement as he scored 11 points in 15 minutes vs. Monmouth, making 5-of-7 from the field

WELCOME WAGON

- Graduate transfer **Troy Holston** made his SJU debut against Wake Forest, playing three minutes and making his first basket

- Holston battled knee injuries through his time at South Florida, which caused him to miss two full seasons

OFF BALANCE

- Against UCF, the Hawks didn't get much scoring from players not named **Charlie Brown** and **Taylor Funk** as the duo combined for 44 of 57 points

- In fact, only three other players were in the scoring column - **Jared Bynum** (6 pts), **Anthony Longpré** (6) and **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (1)

PICKING THE HAWKS

- Saint Joseph's is picked second in the A-10 Preseason Poll, which is the highest for the Hawks since the 2012-13, when they were tabbed first

- Last year's squad was picked third in the poll, and despite two key injuries, finished fourth in the league and reached the semifinals while posting a 16-16 overall record

- **Lamarr Kimble** and **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, were each named to the 2018-19 Atlantic 10 Preseason All-Conference Third Team

THEY'RE BACK

- Two of SJU's leading scorers from two seasons ago — **Lamarr Kimble** and **Charlie Brown, Jr.** — have made their return to the court this season
- Kimble, who averaged 15.5 points per game in 2016-17, reinjured his left foot in the 2017-18 opener and missed the remainder of the season. Kimble originally suffered the fracture in February of 2017 which caused him to miss the final seven games of the year
- Brown never got his 2017-18 season underway as he fractured his left wrist in the preseason, underwent surgery and was sidelined for the year. As a freshman, Brown averaged 12.8 points per game to earn All-Rookie honors

RETURNING CAST

- Among the Hawks' other key returnees this season are:
- **Taylor Funk** (So.) - Team's leading returning scorer from last season (11.8) and the leader in three-point field goals (84), setting a new SJU freshman record
- **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (R-Jr.) - Top rebounder with 6.8 average and 3.0 assists per game
- **Chris Clover** (Sr.) - Starter in 28 games last year, averaging a career-best 8.2 points
- **Anthony Longpré** (So.) - Played in all 32 games as a freshman

NEW TO THE FOLD

- The Hawks welcome three scholarship newcomers in **Jared Bynum** (Fr.), **Troy Holston** (Gr. transfer) and **Ryan Daly** (Jr. transfer)
- Bynum, a point guard from Georgetown Prep averaged over 17 points and six assists last year. He was the IAC Player of the Year and an All-Met selection
- Holston joins the Hawks from South Florida, where he played two seasons while battling knee injuries. Holston, who received his bachelor's degree last spring, averaged 9.7 points in 2016-17. He has two years of eligibility at SJU, effective immediately
- Daly comes "home" to SJU, transferring from Delaware. A native of nearby Ardmore, Pa., Daly scored 1,000 points in two seasons at Delaware and earned All-CAA honors twice. SJU connections run in his family as both of his parents are alums and his late grandfather, Jim Boyle, was the Hawks' head coach from 1981 to 1990. Daly will have two years of eligibility at SJU after sitting out this season
- Junior **Greg Smith** also joins the Hawks as a walk-on this year

SEEING RED

- SJU's roster is dotted with five players who have redshirted at least one season while on Hawk Hill. Although that number seems unusually high, it is actually tied for the fifth most in the nation. Four schools (CSU

Bakersfield, Rider, UCF, Saint Mary's) lead with nine each while Colorado State, Florida Gulf Coast, Norfolk State and Wisconsin have eight redshirts on their active rosters

- Saint Joseph's redshirts are:
 - **Charlie Brown, Jr.** (R-So.) - missed the 2017-18 season with shoulder injury
 - **Lorenzo Edwards** (R-So.) - had shoulder surgery during this freshman year
 - **Lamarr Kimble** (R-Jr.) - reinjured his foot in the first game of 2017-18 and underwent surgery, missing all but one game
 - **Markell Lodge** (R-Sr.) - redshirted his first year to concentrate on academics
 - **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (R-Jr.) - sat out his sophomore season after having surgery to correct a chronic knee condition

DEAN OF COACHES

- **Phil Martelli** enters his 24th season as head coach and is the dean of the Atlantic 10's coaches. He owns an overall record of 434-312 and is SJU's all-time leader in victories
- Martelli owns a 212-164 record in Atlantic 10 play, which ranks second all-time and first among active coaches for conference wins
- Martelli is one of 25 active D-1 coaches who are their schools' all-time wins leaders

FROM THE START

- **Jared Bynum** became the sixth freshman in six years to be in the Hawks' starting lineup on opening day
- Previous freshman starters for SJU were: **Anthony Longpré** (2017-18), **Charlie Brown** (2016-17), **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (2015-16), James Demery (2014-15) and current Atlanta Hawk DeAndre' Bembry (2013-14)

WISE BEYOND THEIR YEARS

- **Phil Martelli** has commented that the Hawks are an "older" team this year with five players who have redshirted previous seasons, including one graduate student (**Troy Holston**)
- The average age of the Hawks' scholarship players is 21 years old
- **Markell Lodge** and **Troy Holston** are both 23, while **Pierfrancesco Oliva** and **Lamarr Kimble** are each 22 years old
- The following are the Hawks' "redshirts" with their respective seasons on campus:
 - **Markell Lodge** (5th)
 - **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (4th)
 - **Lamarr Kimble** (4th)
 - **Lorenzo Edwards** (3rd)
 - **Charlie Brown** (3rd)
- **Troy Holston** is in his first season at SJU after transferring from South Florida. He played two seasons with the Bulls while battling knee injuries
- Also waiting in the wings is transfer **Ryan Daly**, who played two years at Delaware and will be sitting out this season

STRONG FINISH

- Despite facing its second straight season with key injuries in 2017-18, the Hawks came on strong at the end of the year and finished with a 16-16 record
- SJU closed out the regular season winning three straight and six of its last seven to finish in fourth place with a 10-8 record
- The Hawks defeated George Mason in the A-10 Quarterfinals but were edged by top-seeded Rhode Island, 90-87, in the semifinals

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

- One of the highlights of the schedule will be a date with 2018 NCAA Final Four team Loyola Chicago on December 22 at the historic Palestra
- The Hawks will also take on defending national champion Villanova on December 8 in the Wildcats' new Finneran Pavilion
- In addition to Villanova and Loyola Chicago, SJU has four opponents on its schedule which reached last year's NCAA Tournament - Davidson, St. Bonaventure, Penn and Rhode Island. Possible Myrtle Beach Invitational opponents West Virginia and Cal State Fullerton also made the NCAA Tournament in 2017-18

THE INJURY PLAGUE

- Last season was the second consecutive in which the Hawks faced significant injuries to key players
- In 2017-18, **Lamarr Kimble** (foot) and **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, (wrist) were lost for the year. Kimble played in only the season opener and Brown was sidelined in the preseason
- The previous year saw four players miss time with injuries. They were, with games missed: Shavar Newkirk (19), **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (entire season), **Lorenzo Edwards** (all but one game) and **Lamarr Kimble** (7)

HONORING THE COACH

- The Hawks are wearing a patch on their uniforms with "McK" to honor former coach Jack McKinney, who passed away in September
- McKinney was head coach at Saint Joseph's for eight seasons, from 1966 to 1974. He compiled a 144-77 record and owns the third best all-time winning percentage (65.2 pct) among SJU coaches
- McKinney took the Hawks to postseason play five times in his eight years, which included four NCAA Tournament appearances
- He went on to coach in the NBA, although a serious accident cut short his season with the Lakers in 1979. He rebounded to earn NBA Coach of the Year honors with the Indiana Pacers in 1981

HAWKS IN THE NBA

- Saint Joseph's is represented in the NBA by two players:
- Langston Galloway (Pistons) - was undrafted in 2014 but made the Knicks' squad as a free agent; played for the Pelicans and Kings before joining the Pistons in 2017-18
- DeAndre' Bembry (Hawks) - 21st overall draft pick in 2016 by Atlanta, who was the 33rd SJU player to be drafted, and the sixth to be taken in the first round

HOME AT HAGAN

- This marks the 10th season of the Hawks' home, Hagan Arena, after Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse underwent a renovation and expansion in 2008-09
- SJU is 84-43 at Hagan but owns an all-time record of 403-125 in 68 years on campus
- The Hawks went 10-3 at home in 2017-18 and are 3-0 this year

BACK TO BROOKLYN

- The Hawks are happy about the return to the Barclays Center for the A-10 Championship as the arena has been good to them in the past. Saint Joseph's last two Atlantic 10 titles have been won on that court, in 2014 and 2016

CRADLE OF COACHES

- The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of seven SJU graduates have gone on to become head coaches in the NBA, and SJU is tied with Illinois for second on the list of universities with alums that have served as NBA head coaches. Indiana tops the list with 11 graduates.

PHIL MARTELLI Head Coach 24th Season - 434-312

With the 2018-19 season marking his 24th as the head basketball coach at Saint Joseph's, **Phil Martelli** has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, a perennial postseason participant and a key player on the national scene. In doing so, he has earned his place among the top coaches in the school's storied history and is one of the more respected coaches in the game.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 434-312. Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories nine times in his 23 previous seasons, which is the most for any Hawks' coach. His record of 212-164 in Atlantic 10 play is the most conference wins for any active coach and ranks second all-time in the league.

Martelli Highlights:

- He has taken SJU to the postseason in four of the last seven years, and 13 times in the 23 seasons previous to this one, while winning three Atlantic 10 Championships (1997, 2014, 2016)
- Martelli's 18 postseason wins (7 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in school history
- Despite injuries to two key players, his 2017-18 squad won seven of its last nine games, to finish fourth in the Atlantic 10 and reach the conference semifinals
- His 2015-16 team compiled a 28-8 record for the second-most victories for a Hawk team, won its second Atlantic 10 title in three seasons and advanced to the NCAA Second Round for the first time since 2004
- Four of his players have been named the Atlantic 10 Player of the Year, with the most recent being DeAndre' Bemby in 2015-16
- In 2013-14, his veteran team turned in one of the more memorable seasons in school history, adding another A-10 Championship to his résumé as SJU went 24-10 and reached the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time under Martelli, falling to eventual national champion Connecticut in overtime
- Seven players have reached the NBA, including first round draft picks DeAndre' Bemby (2016), Jameer Nelson (2004) and Delonte West (2004) and a second-round selection, Ahmad Nivins (2009). Dwayne Jones and Ronald Roberts, Jr. had NBA stints while undrafted free agent Langston Galloway earned All-Rookie Second Team honors with the New York Knicks in 2015. Galloway (Detroit) and Bemby (Atlanta) are currently playing in the NBA
- In 2003-04, he guided a squad that became the most compelling story in college basketball - the Hawks went undefeated in the regular season, were the top-ranked team in the nation and earned the school's first-ever number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the Elite Eight
- Joined with Jameer Nelson to sweep the National Coach and Player of the Year awards in 2004, marking one of the few times in history that the top player and coach were from the same school
- Current member of the NCAA Division I Basketball Oversight Committee; previously served the game as a Past President of the NABC's Board of Directors, and the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Ethics Coalition
- Is very involved with Coaches vs. Cancer, is the past chair of the National Council, and the co-chair of the Philadelphia chapter, which is one of the largest fundraising groups in this effort in the nation
- Was the co-recipient of the Circle of Honor Award given by the American Cancer Society in 2017, honored along with Temple's Fran Dunphy
- Has spent a total of 34 years with the Hawks' program, serving as an assistant coach for 10 years prior to attaining the top job in July, 1995

THE HAWK

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Saint Joseph's Hawk is in its 63rd year in 2018-19.

The Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die."

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season.

In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant motion, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" A few years ago, ESPN used a "flap-o-meter" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game, and the student who holds the position gains a tuition scholarship. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also serves as a team manager for the men's basketball team and travels with the squad.

Domenic Godshall will serve as the Saint Joseph's University Hawk mascot for the 2018-19 season, becoming the 39th student to represent the University in this role. He is a senior sports marketing major from Lititz, Pa.



ON THE AIR

TV/VIDEO: Saint Joseph's fans will be able to watch all 31 men's basketball regular-season games either on television or through digital media. A total of 21 Hawks' games this season will be televised nationally while 10 will be streamed digitally. Nine games will appear on the subscription-based ESPN+.

RADIO: All 31 Saint Joseph's men's basketball regular-season games will be broadcast on radio, with Talk Radio 1210 WPHT airing the majority of games. It marks the second consecutive year of a partnership with the station. The Saint Joseph's Sports Network team of Matt Martucci and Lunardi will return for their 10th season together, with Lunardi marking his 29th year as the Hawks' color analyst. Also calling play-by-play on selected games for the second straight year is Pat McCarthy. (Schedule on pg. 2)

INTERNET: Information for Saint Joseph's basketball is found at SJU's athletics website, www.SJUHawks.com with statistics, updated game notes, and live in-game statistics for all Hawk home games, and selected road games. Through Hawks All-Access, fans can follow every home game through audio streaming, along with video features and highlights.

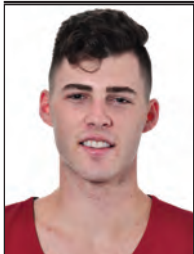

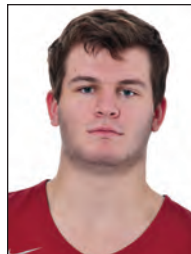
