THE HAWKS

→ **Lorenzo Edwards** scored a career-high 22 points, hitting a perfect 6-for-6 from three-point range, but it wasn't enough as Saint Joseph's was defeated by La Salle, 83-69, in an A-10 and Big 5 game at Gola Arena. **Charlie Brown** scored 19 points and **Troy Holston** had a season-high 13 points

→ This is the second meeting between SJU and Saint Louis this year, with the Billikens winning on their homecourt three weeks ago

→ **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, is the leading scorer in the A-10 with 19.9 ppg

→ **Anthony Longpré** remains sidelined for this game, missing his sixth game due to a concussion, which occurred at Saint Louis on Jan. 18

→ For the fifth straight game, SJU will have seven full scholarship players available to play

→ Tonight marks the second of four A-10 ESPN Friday Night Showcase games for the Hawks, and the second one against Saint Louis. SJU will also face Davidson on Feb. 15 and VCU on March 8

→ SJU will play its fourth straight game in Philadelphia on Tuesday when it hosts St. Bonaventure in the second meeting of the year

→ This a Jesuit Basketball Spotlight game, which aims to raise awareness for Jesuit education (more on page 4)

- The teams met just a few weeks ago in St. Louis, with the Billikens coming out on top, 68-57
- Saint Louis has won three in a row over the Hawks and has scored a victory in 12 of the last 13 meetings
- SJU's last win over Saint Louis came here in Hagan Arena on Feb. 28, 2016
- This is the first time in the history of the series that the teams are playing twice in the regular season
- The Hawks' greatest success in the series came in 2005-06 when they scored two wins in SLU's first year in the Atlantic 10, once in regular-season play and once in the A-10 Tournament

LAST TIME OUT

- **Lorenzo Edwards** scored a career-high 22 points, hitting a perfect 6-for-6 from three-point range, but it wasn't enough as Saint Joseph's was defeated by La Salle, 83-69, in an A-10 and Big 5 game at Gola Arena
- SJU made a season-high 14 three-pointers in the game while La Salle connected on 15
- Edwards was 8-for-9 from the field while **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, had 19 points and five assists. **Troy Holston** had a career-high 13 points on 5-for-8 shooting
- La Salle held a double-digit lead for most of the game but Edwards got SJU within 76-68 with 2:25 to play. Another La Salle three with two minutes left pushed the lead back to 79-68 and the Explorers sealed it with 4-of-4 free throws in the final minute

LAST TIME VS. SAINT LOUIS

- A 23-0 run midway through the second half helped Saint Louis pull away from Saint Joseph's for the 68-57 win at Chaifetz Arena on Jan. 18
- **Jared Bynum** led SJU with 18 points and eight assists while **Taylor Funk** chipped in 10 points and 12 rebounds for his first career double-double. **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, was limited to nine points, ending a 33-game double-figure scoring streak
- The Hawks opened the second half with a 10-2 run, including six points from Bynum, to pull within 36-35. But SLU answered with 23 straight points to take a 56-35 lead as the Hawks were held scoreless for over six minutes until Funk connected on a three-pointer with 6:38 to play. Saint Louis then took its biggest lead, 59-35, with seven minutes remaining, and saw the Hawks come within nine points, 63-54, with 33 seconds left

HEAVY HEARTS

- The Hawks and coach **Phil Martelli** are playing this game after the passing of the coach's father - Phil "Pops" Martelli - on Tuesday
- Mr. Martelli was a fixture at practices, games and road trips over the past 24 years until health issues limited his travel two years ago
- He was in attendance at SJU's win over UMass last Saturday

LORENZO'S LINE

- **Lorenzo Edwards** had a career game offensively at La Salle, scoring a personal-best 22 points on 8-for-9 shooting
- The redshirt sophomore was also a perfect 6-for-6 from three-point range. His previous high for threes made in a game was two
- A starter in three straight games, Edwards scored a then-personal best 14 points in the win over UMass last Saturday

- In the past two games, Edwards has connected on 12-of-17 from the field and 8-of-10 from beyond the arc

RAINING THREES

- The Hawks hit a season-high 14 three pointers in the loss at La Salle, and almost matched the Explorers' total of 15
- It was the most long-range field goals for the Hawks since they had 13 against West Virginia in November
- SJU also converted a season-high 53.8 percent (14-of-26) three pointers, marking the first time since the West Virginia game that they exceeded 50 percent
- Surprisingly, the three-point performance against La Salle came after SJU went 4-for-23 versus UMass

AT THE LINE

- SJU's 22-for-26 effort at the foul line vs. UMass was the most free throws made since the Hawks hit a season-high 36 in the win over UIC on Nov. 29
- More importantly, they hit 8-of-10 in the final five minutes vs. UMass
- **Lorenzo Edwards** made a pair of free throws with :04 left to secure the win

ADDING THEM UP

- **Charlie Brown** surpassed the 400-point mark for the season (438) and now has 836 points in 53 career games

DROPPING OFF

- Saint Joseph's had been holding the number-two spot in the national rankings for fewest turnovers since the beginning of the year, as they averaged eight per game, but has fallen in the past few weeks
- The Hawks are now fifth in the nation in turnovers per game (9.6) and seventh in total turnovers (220). Virginia leads the NCAA with 9.0 per game

IRON MEN

- SJU's injury situation has certainly pushed the Hawks into increased minutes, especially **Jared Bynum** and **Charlie Brown**
- Bynum has played all 40 minutes in seven consecutive games, upping his season average to 36.3, which ranks fifth in the A-10 and 33rd in the nation. He is playing 38.0 minutes in league games, to rank fourth in the A-10
- Bynum's average of 36.3 minutes is currently tied with Boo Williams (1977-78) for SJU's freshman record
- Brown has seen 40 minutes for four games in a row and six times this year. He's averaging 35.5 minutes and 37.9 in conference games

BEYOND THE ARC

- **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, ranks fifth in the A-10 in three-point percentage (37.9) and is sixth in threes made per game (2.3)
- Saint Joseph's is sixth in the A-10 in team 3-point percentage, hitting 31.5 percent. The 14-for-26 effort at La Salle bumped the Hawks' percentage in A-10 games to 30.1 percent and the ninth spot in the rankings (previously 14)

HELP FROM HOLSTON

- Grad transfer **Troy Holston** had his second double-figure game at SJU when he scored 13 points at La Salle
- His previous SJU high was 11 points in the win over Davidson

FLYING START

- SJU got off to its best start of the year at Dayton, but couldn't sustain it in the loss
- **Charlie Brown** opened the game scoring 10 straight points as the Hawks took a quick 10-3 lead. Brown hit his first five shots to give him 12 points by the 14:21 mark. He had 15 in the half and 19 in the game
- The Hawks made seven of their first eight shots and were hitting 8-of-11 as they took a 19-12 lead

LUCKY CLOVER

- **Chris Clover** matched his career-high at Dayton, scoring 21 points for the fourth time in his career. He shot 6-for-11 from the field and made 3-of-5 three-pointers
- The senior is averaging 11.2 ppg in the last eight contests in which he's started seven

CHARLES IN CHARGE

- **Charlie Brown** had the game you'd expect from the A-10's leading scorer to key the comeback win over Richmond. He finished with 31 points and a career-high 14 rebounds for the first double-double of his career
- In the second half, he connected on 6-of-9 from the field, and 3-of-4 from three-point range
- That performance came after Brown scored just nine points at Saint Louis, which was his first time without double figures since Jan. 7, 2017 against Fordham (0 points)
- Brown then notched his second straight double-double with 27 points and 12 rebounds in the loss to Penn
- He now has 10 career games with 20-plus points and two with 30-plus points

STARTING OUT

- **Lorenzo Edwards** made the first start of his career in place of **Taylor Funk** at Dayton, which ended Funk's streak of 42 consecutive games started, and has started the past three contests

- **Markell Lodge** has started five in a row for **Anthony Longpré** (concussion protocol), whose return is still undetermined
- Because of the injuries to Longpré, **Lamarr Kimble** and **Pierfrancesco Oliva**, the Hawks now have seven full scholarship players available to play

JESUIT VS. JESUIT

- Tonight's contest is a Jesuit Basketball Spotlight game as SJU and Saint Louis are both Jesuit universities
- The Jesuit Basketball Spotlight, which is in its eighth year, highlights games between men's and women's teams from the 28 Jesuit colleges and universities across the U.S. Other Jesuit schools on the Hawks' schedule are Fordham and Loyola Chicago

PUTTING UP SHOTS

- **Charlie Brown** has totalled 99 field goal attempts in the past five games, including 23 against Penn
- **Phil Martelli** said, "He's playing the game easier. His teammates are getting him the ball and I like the fact that he's getting shot attempts."
- As a team, the Hawks took a season-high 72 shots vs. Penn, making 29 (40.3%), and attempted 24 three-pointers, making only three (12.5%)
- SJU is averaging 59 field goal attempts and 26 three-point attempts per game

THE INJURY PLAGUE

- Saint Joseph's has certainly faced its share of significant injuries in three consecutive years, adding the current injuries to **Pierfrancesco Oliva** and **Lamarr Kimble**
- Oliva will miss the rest of the season and Kimble is sidelined indefinitely as both sustained injuries in the Hawks' loss at Duquesne
- Oliva, a redshirt junior forward, dislocated his left knee in the first half of the game and has ligament damage. He will require surgery but his rehabilitation timetable is unspecified
- Kimble, a redshirt junior guard, suffered a fracture in his right hand in the second half
- **Anthony Longpré**, is currently in concussion protocol after being injured at Saint Louis and has missed the last five games
- In 2017-18, Kimble (foot) and **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, (wrist) were lost for the year. Kimble played in only the season opener and Brown was sidelined in the preseason
- The 2016-17 season saw four players miss time with injuries - Shavar Newkirk (19 gms), Oliva (entire season), **Lorenzo Edwards** (all but one game) and Kimble (7 gms)

ON THE REBOUND

- SJU dominated the boards against Richmond and Penn, outrebounding their foes by 91-59. The Hawks registered a season-high 47 boards vs. Penn
- In the Richmond win, **Charlie Brown** and **Chris Clover** each recorded personal bests with 14 and 10 rebounds, respectively

OUT OF THE FUNK

- **Taylor Funk** came up with big plays against Richmond as he hit the tying three-pointer with 34.3 seconds to go. The sophomore also blocked a UR shot with 9.5 seconds left
- Funk connected on 4-of-9 three-pointers in the game, the most since he had four against UIC on Nov. 28
- He has struggled from the perimeter lately, and in the six games prior to Richmond was a combined 5-for-35 from three-point range
- Funk has come off the bench in the past three games and hit for 11 points at Dayton, connecting on three three-pointers

CLOVER IN THE CLUTCH

- Senior **Chris Clover** had his best game of the year when the Hawks needed it, helping the win over Davidson
- Starting in place of the injured **Lamarr Kimble**, Clover scored a season-high 18 points while hitting a personal best four three-pointers, including the eventual game winner with 59 seconds to play
- Clover had a career-high 10 rebounds in the win over Richmond and the posted 14 points and eight rebounds vs. Penn

LODGE IN THE LINEUP

- **Markell Lodge** made his first start of the year when he filled in for **Anthony Longpré** vs. Richmond. It was his first since he started all 31 games in 2016-17
- Lodge had seven points and four rebounds in 22 minutes against the Spiders
- The redshirt senior has started the last five, and provides great energy to the lineup. He saw a career-high 33 minutes at Dayton

NEXT MAN UP

- With the Hawks facing the absence of two key players, **Phil Martelli** didn't buy into the "next man up" theory, but it certainly seemed like the players did against Davidson
- Senior **Chris Clover** started in place of **Lamarr Kimble** and had his best game of the year with a season-high 18 points
- Graduate transfer **Troy Holston** had his first double-figure game with the Hawks, contributing 11 points, with three three-pointers, in a season-high 21 minutes
- Redshirt senior **Markell Lodge** contributed five rebounds and two blocked shots

ON AND OFF SCORING

- After scoring 60 points or less in six straight games, the Hawks' offense got back to normal and tallied 84 in the loss at Duquesne
- But they slipped back into sub-70 mode vs. Davidson (61) and Saint Louis (57), giving them under 62 points in eight straight games
- SJU is averaging 63.6 ppg in A-10 games, and has been outscored by 9.5 points. The Hawks are shooting 37.8 percent from the field and 30.1 percent from three in league contests

BYTES ON BYNUM

- **Jared Bynum** has been impressive in his first year and is averaging 11.4 points and leading the team in assists with 4.4
- **Phil Martelli** said, "He might be a freshman academically and socially, but he's a basketball player. He belongs in these games."
- Bynum, who has scored double figures 13 times, had a career-high eight assists at Duquesne and bettered that with nine assists vs. Davidson

- He had a team-high 18 points, as well as six rebounds and eight assists, at Saint Louis
- Bynum now ranks second in the A-10 in assist/turnover ratio (2.2) after leading for most of the season. He averages 4.4 assists to 2.0 turnovers

PEP RALLY

- The Hawks fought back from a 15-point first-half deficit to rally for the win over Richmond
- It was the largest deficit overcome for a win this season, surpassing the 13 points in the Illinois Chicago game on Nov. 28

GAME OF RUNS

- A 23-0 run by the home team doomed the Hawks at Saint Louis. SJU was within 36-35 at 13:05 before the Billikens scored 23 straight points over six minutes to take a 56-35 lead. **Taylor Funk** ended the drought for the Hawks on a three-pointer with 6:38 left, but it was too much for SJU to overcome in the 68-57 loss
- The Hawks appeared to be suffering the same fate vs. Richmond as the Spiders ran off 16 straight points in the first half, staking a 21-10 lead and then a 30-15 edge. SJU turned things around in the second half to post the 74-70 win
- Other notable scoring droughts:
 - SJU scored 59 points vs. Wagner; went without a FG in the final 4:53 of the game
 - George Mason had a 19-0 run in six minutes during the final 10 minutes of the game
 - GW closed out the game w/ 13 straight and a 16-4 run in the final five minutes
 - St. Bonaventure took a 17-1 lead and had a 39-12 halftime lead
 - After a strong start by SJU, Dayton used a 14-0 run over the final 10 minutes of the first half, and then a 13-2 run midway through the second
 - La Salle scored nine straight points early in the game to build up a 10-point lead that the Hawks could never overcome

TO THE POINT

- After scoring 70-plus points in eight of their first nine games, the Hawks averaged just 54.2 in six games from Dec. 8 to Jan. 9
- The low was 45 points vs. Loyola Chicago but thankfully, the Ramblers scored only 16 points in the first half and finished with 42 in the game, as SJU came away with the win
- The 45 points was SJU's lowest output since it scored 40 against Charlotte (3/9/13)

SLOW START

- SJU's 0-4 start in the A-10 matched the 2010-11 season when the Hawks went 0-8 to begin conference play. That team won four of its last six as it reached the semifinals of the A-10 Championship
- SJU has often found success in the latter half of the season. Last year's squad was 4-5 in

Phil Martelli is a member of a select group, as one of eight active D-1 head coaches who have 400+ wins and have only coached at one school. Here's the list:

January but went on to post a 6-3 record in February

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

- SJU is fifth in the nation in turnovers per game (9.6) and seventh in fewest number of turnovers (220)
- Despite a season-high 14 turnovers, the Hawks came away with a win over Richmond
- The Hawks have committed 10-plus turnovers 12 times this season, and in 11 of the last 14 games
- Freshman **Jared Bynum** is second in the A-10 in assist/turnover ratio with 2.2, with 102 assists this year to just 46 turnovers

DOUBLING DOWN

- **Charlie Brown** has scored double figures in 21 of 22 games played this year, while **Lamarr Kimble** has hit double digits in 14
- Brown missed one game (Villanova) due to injury, and saw his 33-game double-figure scoring streak come to an end at Saint Louis (9 points)
- Kimble went without double figures against UCF and GW

HANDS OFF

- As they have done the past few seasons, the Hawks have limited their fouls and rank 21st in the nation with fewest fouls (334)
- SJU ranks eighth in the NCAA in personal fouls per game with 14.5

TWO SIDES OF THE BALL

- Early on, **Phil Martelli** was concerned about the Hawks' defense, as SJU was giving up 76.8 points per game through the first nine
- That seemed to be rectified as the Hawks allowed an average of 56 points in the three games (Villanova, Loyola, Wagner) leading up to the conference opener
- But that progress suffered a setback as Saint Joseph's saw George Mason score 85 points and more recently, La Salle post 84 points
- On the year, SJU's foes are now averaging 72.6 points per game

SLIPPING AWAY

- The loss to GW marked the third double-digit lead lost by the Hawks this year
- SJU had a 12-point lead with 12:41 to go in the first half but saw GW turn in a big second half en route to the 70-56 win
- Against Temple they led by 11 with 3:29 to play in the first half but suffered the 77-70 loss
- At William & Mary, SJU held a 20-point lead at 18:38 of the second half but saw the Tribe rally to the 87-85 win

COOLING OFF

- The Hawks started the season as one of the better three-point shooting teams in the nation but have since cooled off
- SJU has made under 30 percent of its three-point attempts in nine of the last 15 games
- The Hawks are converting 93-of-341 (27.2 percent) from behind the arc in the past 11 games. The low point was a 0-for-13 effort in the first half at St. Bonaventure
- Saint Joseph's bucked that trend when it connected on 12-of-28 threes (42.9%) in the win over Richmond, led by a 5-for-8 performance from **Charlie Brown**
- SJU also made a season-high 14 three-pointers at La Salle, shooting 53.7 percent (31 attempts), which was the highest of the year
- The Hawks followed that by shooting 3-for-24 from three-point range vs. Penn

DEAN OF COACHES

- **Phil Martelli** is in his 24th season as head coach and is the dean of the Atlantic 10's coaches. He owns an overall record of 440-322 and is SJU's all-time leader in victories
- Martelli owns a 215-171 record in Atlantic 10 play, which ranks second all-time and first among active coaches for conference wins
- His career total of 440 wins is also second all-time (to Temple's John Chaney) and the top number for active coaches in the A-10
- Martelli is one of 25 active D-1 coaches who are their schools' all-time wins leaders

WHAT BROWN CAN DO FOR YOU

- **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, established a new career-high for the third time this year when he poured in 37 points at William & Mary
- He scored 23 in the first half, the highest single-half total of his career, hitting 11-of-17 from the field and 11-of-14 from the foul line
- His 37 points are tied as the seventh highest single-game scoring total in SJU history
- Brown is the leading scorer in the A-10 with his 19.9 average
- The last Hawk to average 20-plus points in a full season was Jameer Nelson (20.6) in 2003-04. Shavar Newkirk averaged 20.3 ppg in 2016-17, but he played only 12 games after being sidelined with an injury

RECOGNIZING HARD WORK

- **Phil Martelli** announced that walk-ons **Mike Muggeo** and **Toliver Freeman** have both been awarded scholarships for the Spring semester
- Muggeo, a 6-3 senior guard, earned a spot on the squad as a walk-on in 2017-18, but was unavailable to play last year due to an injury
- Freeman is a 6-3 guard who joined the Hawks as a walk-on in 2016-17. He has seen action in 10 games during his career, including four this season

THE CAPTAIN, THE HERO

- **Lamarr Kimble** hit the game-winner with 0.4 left on the clock to lift Saint Joseph's to a 45-42 win over Loyola Chicago at The Palestra
- It was the team captain's third game-winning shot as a Hawk
- "It wasn't exactly the way we drew it up," said coach **Phil Martelli**. "But he's got a little bit of freedom, because his heart's bigger than his body."

ALL ABOUT ANTHONY

- **Anthony Longpré** connected on three three-pointers for a season-high 10 points against George Mason
- He followed that a career-high 11 rebounds, to go along with eight points, vs. GW, and had a team-high six rebounds at St. Bonaventure
- Longpré had another strong game on the boards at Duquesne, leading the squad with nine to go along with nine points
- He has missed four straight games after suffering a concussion at Saint Louis

BROWN'S BIG WEEK

- **Charlie Brown** earned Player of the Week honors from the Atlantic 10 and Big 5 (co-player) on Jan. 28 as he averaged 29.0 points and 13.0 rebounds while shooting 45.5 percent from the field (20-of-44) and 92.3 percent (12-for-13) from the foul line
- He had 31 points and a career-high 14 rebounds for his first-ever double-double in the win over Richmond. He then notched his second straight double-double with 27 points and 13 rebounds in the loss to Penn

BYNUM'S WEEK

- **Jared Bynum** was named the A-10 Co-Rookie of the Week for Jan. 21, earning weekly honors for the second time this year
- The freshman averaged 15.0 points, 6.5 rebounds and 8.5 assists per game against Davidson and Saint Louis

FRESH APPROACH

- **Lamarr "Fresh" Kimble** helped the Hawks pull away at Princeton as he poured in 22 second-half points

- The captain made 8-of-12 from the field in the half, and had 10 of 13 points as SJU expanded on a three-point halftime lead, going up by 53-45
- It was the second game in which Kimble had a big second half to help the Hawks to the win; he previously scored 24 of his career-high-tying 31 points vs. UIC in the second half
- Prior to his injury, Kimble was averaging a career-best 16.3 points per game, and has scored 20-plus points in four games

LIFT FROM LODGE

- **Markell Lodge** gave the Hawks a lift at Princeton, recording season-highs of nine points and 14 minutes
- Lodge had three dunks in the game, including one to start a 5-0 run with under six minutes to play, which helped seal the win
- He followed that with 13 minutes at Villanova in which he contributed five points
- Lodge had a season-high three blocks in the Loyola win and matched that with three against George Mason
- He has 16 blocks in A-10 contests to rank fifth in the league

ON BOARD

- **Taylor Funk** now leads the Hawks in rebounding with 6.1 in overall games and 6.9 in A-10 games. **Charlie Brown** is averaging 5.5 in league contests
- **Pierfrancesco Oliva** had been the Hawks' top rebounder for the first part of the season as he had double-figure rebounds four times

DEPTH CHARGES

- The Hawks have not gotten much scoring from their bench this season and it has been a factor in 10 of the 13 losses, as SJU's reserves have been outscored, 286-85, in those games.
- Here's the bench scoring breakdown:

- In the win over Princeton, the teams were tied in bench scoring, 20-20, and in the Loyola Chicago win, the SJU held a 9-6 edge
- The Hawks were on the short end of bench scoring against Wagner, 23-11, but still captured the victory
- The Hawks' reserves held an 11-10 edge in the loss at St. Bonaventure
- SJU outscored Davidson's bench, 15-7, in the victory

TAYLOR'S THREE'S

- Sophomore **Taylor Funk** has 125 three-pointers in the 55 games of his career thus far, and reached 100 quicker than any other Hawk. By comparison, all-time leader Langston Galloway made 75 threes in his first 37 games
- Funk set the SJU freshman record last season when he made 84 in 32 games
- He hit a career-best 6-for-7 from beyond the arc in the win over Wake Forest

20/20

- **Charlie Brown, Jr.** has tallied 20-plus points in nine of 22 games; he has reached 20-plus points 10 times in 53 career games

SHARP SHOOTERS

- The Hawks have shot 50 percent or better in 11 of 44 halves played this year, with a high of 58.6 percent in the second half of the Monmouth win
- SJU converted more than 50 percent in both halves at Princeton, making 55.0 percent in the game

END TO END

- The win at Princeton was the only game this season that the Hawks held the lead from start to finish. There were two ties, but SJU never let the Tigers forge ahead

30 FOR 30

- SJU received individual 30-point efforts in three consecutive games, as **Lamarr Kimble** netted 31 vs. West Virginia and UIC while **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, had at 37 points at William & Mary
- Brown added another to the list when he scored 31 against Richmond

CHECK IT OUT

- The Hawks are missing the rebounding and passing ability of **Pierfrancesco "Checco" Oliva**, who was the team's top rebounder before his season-ending injury

- **Phil Martelli** said that although he doesn't like labels, "Oliva is the epitome of a point-forward"

CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

- Redshirt junior **Lamarr "Fresh" Kimble** was voted team captain for the third consecutive season, becoming the only player in SJU history to serve as captain for three years
- As a sophomore, Kimble became just the third player in Hawk history to be named a captain in his second season
- Kimble's leadership is appreciated by **Phil Martelli**: "I'm glad he's on my team and I'm glad he's in my program because whatever I need . . . He's in charge of that locker room... Fresh is just legit. He's one of those guys that embraces being a Philadelphian and playing in Philadelphia.... I'm a big Fresh fan, forget the basketball. He is the epitome of a captain."

LOOK AT LORENZO

- **Phil Martelli** stated in the preseason that redshirt sophomore **Lorenzo Edwards** was one player who had made the biggest strides over the summer
- Edwards gave a glimpse of that improvement as he scored 11 points in 15 minutes vs. Monmouth, making 5-of-7 from the field
- He has seen action in 19 games this year and is averaging 12.8 minutes
- Edwards notched a career-high four blocks against George Mason
- He missed three games with a shoulder injury but returned to action at Saint Louis
- Edwards turned in a strong effort vs. Richmond with seven rebounds and two blocks and had seven points and a season-high eight rebounds against Penn
- In his second consecutive start, he scored a career-high 14 points as the Hawks defeated UMass

PRODUCTIVE 20 MINUTES

- **Lamarr Kimble's** 22-point second half at Princeton was his second 20-plus point half of the year, and the third highest of the season
- Kimble had 24 points in the second half against UIC which is highest single-half total for a Hawk this season. **Charlie Brown** scored 23 of his 37 points vs. William & Mary in the first half
- More recently, Brown scored 23 in the second half to finish with 31 in the win over Richmond

SITTING AND WAITING

- Junior **Ryan Daly** is sitting out the year after transferring from Delaware, and will have two years with the Hawks
- A native of nearby Ardmore, Pa., Daly scored 1,000 points in two seasons at Delaware and earned All-CAA honors twice

- SJU connections run in his family as both of his parents are alums and his late grandfather, Jim Boyle, was the Hawks' head coach from 1981 to 1990. His first cousin is Thomas Boyle, the Hawks' director of operations

SEEING RED

- SJU's roster is dotted with five players who have redshirted at least one season while on Hawk Hill. Although that number seems unusually high, it is actually tied for the fifth most in the nation. Four schools (CSU Bakersfield, Rider, UCF, Saint Mary's) lead with nine each while four schools have eight red-shirts on their active rosters
- Saint Joseph's redshirts are:
 - **Charlie Brown, Jr.** (R-So.) - missed the 2017-18 season with shoulder injury
 - **Lorenzo Edwards** (R-So.) - had shoulder surgery during this freshman year
 - **Lamarr Kimble** (R-Jr.) - reinjured his foot in the first game of 2017-18 and underwent surgery, missing all but one game
 - **Markell Lodge** (R-Sr.) - redshirted his first year to concentrate on academics
 - **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (R-Jr.) - sat out his sophomore season after having surgery to correct a chronic knee condition

FROM THE START

- **Jared Bynum** became the sixth freshman in six years to be in the Hawks' starting lineup on opening day
- Previous freshman starters for SJU were: **Anthony Longpré** (2017-18), **Charlie Brown** (2016-17), **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (2015-16), James Demery (2014-15) and current Atlanta Hawk DeAndre' Bemby (2013-14)

WISE BEYOND THEIR YEARS

- **Phil Martelli** commented that the Hawks are an "older" team this year with five players who have redshirted previous seasons and one graduate student (**Troy Holston**)
- **Markell Lodge** is 24, Holston is 23, and **Charlie Brown**, **Pierfrancesco Oliva** and **Lamarr Kimble** are each 22 years old
- The following are the Hawks' "redshirts" with their respective seasons on campus:
 - **Markell Lodge** (5th)
 - **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (4th)
 - **Lamarr Kimble** (4th)
 - **Lorenzo Edwards** (3rd)
 - **Charlie Brown** (3rd)
- Holston is in his first season at SJU after transferring from South Florida. He played two seasons with the Bulls while battling knee injuries

PICKING THE HAWKS

- Saint Joseph's was picked second in the A-10 Preseason Poll, which is the highest for the Hawks since 2012-13, when they were first
- Last year's squad was picked third in the poll, and despite two key injuries, finished fourth in the league and reached the semifinals while posting a 16-16 overall record
- **Lamarr Kimble** and **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, were each named to the 2018-19 Atlantic 10 Preseason All-Conference Third Team

STRONG FINISH

- Despite facing its second straight season with key injuries in 2017-18, the Hawks came on strong at the end of the year and finished with a 16-16 record
- SJU closed out the regular season winning three straight and six of its last seven to finish in fourth place with a 10-8 record
- The Hawks defeated George Mason in the A-10 Quarterfinals but were edged by top-seeded Rhode Island, 90-87, in the semifinals

HONORING THE COACH

- The Hawks are wearing a patch on their uniforms with "McK" to honor former coach Jack McKinney, who passed away in September
- McKinney was head coach at Saint Joseph's for eight seasons, from 1966 to 1974. He compiled a 144-77 record and owns the third best all-time winning percentage (65.2 pct) among SJU coaches

- McKinney took the Hawks to postseason play five times in his eight years, which included four NCAA Tournament appearances
- He went on to coach in the NBA, although a serious accident cut short his season with the Lakers in 1979. He rebounded to earn NBA Coach of the Year honors with the Indiana Pacers in 1981

FUTURE HAWKS

- Saint Joseph's signed two standouts to national letters of intent during the early signing period – Hakim Hart and Kenan Sarvan
- Hart, a 6-5, 190-pound, swingman from Roman Catholic High School in Philadelphia, averaged 15.1 points per game last season and earned All-Catholic League honors. He helped Roman win the 2018 Philadelphia Catholic League championship and the 2018 PIAA 6A State Championship
- Sarvan is a 6-9, 220-pound forward originally from Holland and currently attending Bishop Sullivan Catholic High School in Virginia Beach. As a junior, he averaged 14.6 points and 7.8 rebounds for the Crusaders

CRADLE OF COACHES

- The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of seven SJU graduates have gone on to become head coaches in the NBA, and SJU is tied with Illinois for second on the list of universities with alums that have served as NBA head coaches. Indiana tops the list with 11 graduates.

PHIL MARTELLI Head Coach 24th Season - 440-322

With the 2018-19 season marking his 24th as the head basketball coach at Saint Joseph's, **Phil Martelli** has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, a perennial postseason participant and a key player on the national scene. In doing so, he has earned his place among the top coaches in the school's storied history and is one of the more respected coaches in the game.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 440-322. Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories nine times in his 23 previous seasons, which is the most for any Hawks' coach. His record of 215-171 in Atlantic 10 play is the most conference wins for any active coach and ranks second all-time in the league.

Martelli Highlights:

- He has taken SJU to the postseason in four of the last seven years, and 13 times in the 23 seasons previous to this one, while winning three Atlantic 10 Championships (1997, 2014, 2016)
- Martelli's 18 postseason wins (7 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in school history
- Despite injuries to two key players, his 2017-18 squad won seven of its last nine games, to finish fourth in the Atlantic 10 and reach the conference semifinals
- His 2015-16 team compiled a 28-8 record for the second-most victories for a Hawk team, won its second Atlantic 10 title in three seasons and advanced to the NCAA Second Round for the first time since 2004
- Four of his players have been named the Atlantic 10 Player of the Year, with the most recent being DeAndre' Bemby in 2015-16
- In 2013-14, his veteran team turned in one of the more memorable seasons in school history, adding another A-10 Championship to his résumé as SJU went 24-10 and reached the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time under Martelli, falling to eventual national champion Connecticut in overtime
- Seven players have reached the NBA, including first round draft picks DeAndre' Bemby (2016), Jameer Nelson (2004) and Delonte West (2004) and a second-round selection, Ahmad Nivins (2009). Dwayne Jones and Ronald Roberts, Jr. had NBA stints while undrafted free agent Langston Galloway earned All-Rookie Second Team honors with the New York Knicks in 2015. Galloway (Detroit) and Bemby (Atlanta) are currently playing in the NBA
- In 2003-04, he guided a squad that became the most compelling story in college basketball - the Hawks went undefeated in the regular season, were the top-ranked team in the nation and earned the school's first-ever number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the Elite Eight
- Joined with Jameer Nelson to sweep the National Coach and Player of the Year awards in 2004, marking one of the few times in history that the top player and coach were from the same school
- Current member of the NCAA Division I Basketball Oversight Committee; previously served the game as a Past President of the NABC's Board of Directors, and the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Ethics Coalition
- Is very involved with Coaches vs. Cancer, is the past chair of the National Council, and the co-chair of the Philadelphia chapter, which is one of the largest fundraising groups in this effort in the nation
- Was the co-recipient of the Circle of Honor Award given by the American Cancer Society in 2017, honored along with Temple's Fran Dunphy
- Has spent a total of 34 years with the Hawks' program, serving as an assistant coach for 10 years prior to attaining the top job in July, 1995

THE HAWK

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Saint Joseph's Hawk is in its 63rd year in 2018-19.

The Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die."

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season.

In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant motion, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" A few years ago, ESPN used a "flap-o-meter" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game, and the student who holds the position gains a tuition scholarship. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also serves as a team manager for the men's basketball team and travels with the squad.

Domenic Godshall is serving as the Saint Joseph's University Hawk mascot for the 2018-19 season, becoming the 39th student to represent the University in this role. He is a senior sports marketing major from Lititz, Pa.



ON THE AIR

TV/VIDEO: Saint Joseph's fans will be able to watch all 31 men's basketball regular-season games either on television or through digital media. Through Hawks All-Access, fans can follow every home game through audio streaming, along with video features and highlights.

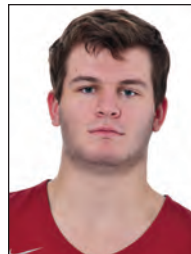
