THE HAWKS

- Saint Joseph's was edged by Rhode Island, 86-85, in overtime in the home finale. **Jared Bynum** had 19 points and seven assists for SJU
- **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, is the leading scorer in the A-10 with 19.0 points per game and is second in conference games with 17.5 points per game
- Freshman **Jared Bynum** continues to top the league in assist/turnover ratio (2.5) while the Hawks rank fourth in the nation in fewest turnovers per game (9.3). Bynum also ranks third in the A-10 in minutes in conference games, averaging 37.9 per game
- The Hawks lead the A-10 in free throw percentage in conference games at 76.1 percent
- This is SJU's fourth Friday night game of the year. They previously defeated Saint Louis at home and lost to Saint Louis and Davidson on the road. It is also the Hawks' third game with a tip-off after 9 p.m., with the loss at Davidson and win at Fordham being the previous late-night starts
- Saint Joseph's awaits the final Atlantic 10 games on Saturday to determine its seeding and opponent for next week's conference championship at the Barclays Center, which was the site of SJU's last two conference titles (2014, 2016)

- The Hawks have won two of the last three against VCU and four of the last seven
- Two of the last victories over VCU have come in the A-10 Championship game, in 2014 and 2016
- In the last meeting here at the Siegel Center (Feb. 14, 2017) Saint Joseph's fell to the Rams, 91-81, in its first game without **Lamarr Kimble**, after he suffered a fractured foot
- The Hawks are 0-4 all-time vs. VCU in games played at the Siegel Center

LAST TIME OUT

• Saint Joseph's was edged by Rhode Island, 86-85, in overtime in the home finale. URI's Fatts Russell scored a career-high 41 points, and his team's final 19 of the game, while sending the game into overtime by hitting a three-pointer with 5.5 seconds to play

• Saint Joseph's held a 75-69 lead with 1:12 to play in regulation, but Russell scored six straight to force the overtime and tallied all nine of URI's points in the extra period

• Saint Joseph's took an 82-81 lead at 2:23 of overtime on a three-pointer by **Troy Holston**, but Russell answered with his seventh three-pointer of the night to give the Rams the lead for good, 84-82. The Hawks pulled within 86-85 on a three-pointer by **Jared Bynum** with :02 left, and after Russell missed two free throws, **Lamarr Kimble's** shot from just inside half court was off the mark

• Bynum led SJU with 19 points and seven assists, while **Chris Clover** had 14 points. **Charlie Brown** and Kimble scored 13 apiece and **Taylor Funk** added 12 points

LAST TIME VS. VCU

• **Taylor Funk** scored 19 points and hit a three-pointer late in overtime to help SJU defeat VCU, 87-81, at Hagan Arena on Jan. 3, 2018

• Tied at 76, Funk opened the extra period hitting three free throws to give Saint Joseph's a 79-76 lead. After VCU answered with a layup, **Pierfrancesco Oliva** hit a jumper at 2:34 to give the Hawks an 81-78 lead. Funk then connected on his fourth three of the night at 1:40 to build SJU's lead up to 84-78. A layup by senior James Demery with :18 to play, and a free throw from Oliva, sealed the win for SJU

FAMILY REUNION

• There will be a Martelli on each bench this evening with head coach **Phil Martelli** on SJU's and his son, Jimmy, on the other bench, as VCU's second-year director of operations

• Martelli's oldest son, Phil, Jr., is also following in his dad's footsteps, and is in his 13th season as a college assistant coach, and currently at Bryant University

CLOSE CALLS

• SJU's last two A-10 defeats have come by a one-point margin, with the most recent being the 86-85 overtime loss to Rhode Island on Wednesday

• The Hawks also saw UMass rally to an 80-79 win on Feb. 23 in Amherst

AT THE LINE

• Saint Joseph's is averaging 20 free throws made in the last four games, shooting 80-for-101 (79.2 percent)

• The Hawks have made 22 free throws in each of the past two games, the win over La Salle and the loss to Rhode Island

• **Lamarr Kimble** has led SJU by converting 24-for-27 free throws in the last four games

SENIOR SENDOFF

• **Chris Clover** helped pace the La Salle win on "Senior Day", with a team-high 19 points on 7-for-10 shooting

• Clover is making the best of the final games of his career, as he's scored double figures in 10 of the last 14 games

HOLDING ON

• Saint Joseph's owned a double-digit lead for most of the game against La Salle and didn't lose it as they had in two recent games (Davidson, UMass)

• SJU was up by as much as 17 against the Explorers and led for all but 1:40 in the game

HE'S BACK

• Redshirt junior **Lamarr "Fresh" Kimble** returned the starting lineup in his third game back after missing 10 games with a fractured hand suffered at Duquesne on Jan. 12

• In the four games he's played upon his return, Kimble is scoring 14.7 points, while hitting 89 percent (24-of-27) from the line

• This season, Kimble is averaging a career-best 16.0 points per game, has scored 20-plus points four times and has posted double figures in 18 of 20 games

• **Phil Martelli** is happy that his captain is back: "Fresh worked his tail off so that his conditioning would be up. On a team that is kind of adrift at times, Fresh is in charge. When he was out, I had to do all of that, and it was exhausting . . . The guys who play in the locker room with him recognize him as a tremendous leader"

ADDING THEM UP

• **Charlie Brown** has surpassed the 500-point mark for the season (550) and now has 947 points in 50 career games

• His season point total is tied for 22nd on SJU's all-time list, matching the total achieved by current Atlanta Hawk DeAndre' Bembry in 2015-16

CARING FOR THE BALL

• Saint Joseph's ranks third in the nation in turnovers per game (9.3) and third in fewest turnovers (277)

• The Hawks are in good company as the top three teams are Michigan, Wisconsin and Virginia each averaging 9.2 per game

THE MASCOT GAME

• The Hawks are facing "Rams" in three of the final four games - Fordham (Feb. 27), Rhode Island on Wednesday and VCU tonight

TALE OF TWO HALVES

- Three straight games - Davidson, UMass and Fordham - were characterized by two distinctly different halves for the Hawks
- They got out quickly at Davidson, opening up a 10-point lead eight minutes into the game. SJU hit a season-high 10 three-pointers in the first half, but then made just two the rest of the way
- Davidson had the hot hand in the second half, connecting on 10 threes, and rallied from a 10-point deficit to earn the win
- SJU held a 17-point lead at halftime at UMass, as they connected on a season-best 66.7 percent (18-27) from the field and 69.2 percent (9-13) from three-point range
- But the Hawks went cold in the second and made only 1-of-11 threes and 6-of-21 field goals. UMass took its only lead of the game with 2.7 seconds remaining
- At Fordham, SJU struggled in the first half, shooting 25 percent and making only 1-of-16 threes to trail by 14 points
- But SJU turned the table in the second, using a 23-0 run over seven minutes to take the lead and earn the win

PEP RALLY

- SJU trailed by 16 points early in the second half at Fordham, but used a 23-0 run to notch the 66-52 win. It was the largest deficit overcome for victory this season
- Earlier this year, the Hawks came from 13 points down to beat Illinois Chicago, and then rallied from a 15-point deficit to defeat Richmond

SENIOR MOMENT

- Saint Joseph's seniors have played their final games in Hagan Arena, and the class was honored in a pre-game ceremony last Saturday against La Salle. The seniors are:
 - **Chris Clover:** 111 games/62 starts; 734 career points; member of 2016 A-10 champion team
 - **Markell Lodge:** 5th-year senior; 82 games/37 starts; member of the 2016 A-10 champion team
 - **Pierfrancesco Oliva:** 77 games/52 starts; freshman starter for '16 A-10 Champions; 406 career rebounds
 - **Mike Muggeo:** 2-year walk-on who earned a scholarship for this semester

LORENZO'S LINE

- **Lorenzo Edwards** played a key role in the comeback at Fordham, as he scored 12 points in the 23-0 run that gave the Hawks the lead
- He finished with 18 points and a career-high 11 rebounds for his first-ever double-double

- Edwards had a career game offensively at La Salle, scoring a personal-best 22 points on 8-for-9 shooting. He was also a perfect 6-for-6 from three-point range; his previous high for threes made in a game had been two
- In 10 games as a starter, Edwards is averaging 10.8 points and shooting 18-of-44 (40.9%) from beyond the arc

SIX SCORERS

- Saint Joseph's had six players score double figures at UMass, marking the first time that's occurred this year
- **Chris Clover** led with 19 points, **Lamarr Kimble** scored 14 and **Lorenzo Edwards** and **Jared Bynum** scored 12 apiece. **Charlie Brown** and **Taylor Funk** each added 11

HOT AND COLD

- SJU hit a blistering 66.7 percent from the field in the first half at UMass, which was the best of the season
- **Lorenzo Edwards** and **Jared Bynum** were both 4-for-4 in the first half, while **Chris Clover** was 3-for-4
- They cooled off drastically in the second half and made just 6-of-21 (28.6%) field goals
- Edwards finished the game going 4-for-5, Bynum was 5-for-6 and Clover was 5-for-7

CAN'T MISS

- **Charlie Brown** was 9-for-9 from the field with 21 points in the first half of the Saint Louis win, helping the Hawks stake an early double-digit lead. He finished the game with 28 points on 10-for-13 shooting
- He had a similar start at Dayton on Jan. 29, when he opened the game scoring 10 straight points to give SJU a quick 10-3 lead

ON TARGET

- In the games vs. La Salle and Saint Louis (Feb. 8), the Hawks shot a combined 50 percent (59-for-118) from the field and 48 percent (26-for-54) from behind the arc
- SJU took 59 field goal attempts in both games, and tied their season-high with 33 made vs. Saint Louis
- At La Salle on Feb. 5, the Hawks connected on a season-high 14 three-pointers

RAINING THREES

- The Hawks hit a season-high 14 three pointers in the loss at La Salle, and converted a season-high 53.8 percent (14-of-26). It marked the first time since the West Virginia game on Nov. 18 that they exceeded 50 percent in three-point shooting
- The Hawks followed that with 12 threes in both the win over Saint Louis and the loss at Davidson

IRON MEN

- SJU's injury situation has certainly pushed the Hawks into increased minutes, especially **Jared Bynum** and **Charlie Brown**
- Bynum saw all 40 minutes in seven consecutive games, finally getting a breather at the end of the Saint Louis win (39 mins)
- At UMass, he played a season-low 29 minutes
- His season average is 36.7, which ranks fifth in the A-10 and 38th in the nation. In league games, Bynum is averaging 37.9 minutes, which is second in the A-10
- Bynum's 36.7 average betters the SJU freshman record of 36.3 minutes per game held by Boo Williams (1977-78)
- Brown also had his 40-minute streak snapped vs. SLU. He has seen 40 minutes in eight games this year and is averaging 35.5 minutes and 37.0 in conference games

MISSING OUT

SJU has faced its share of injuries over the past few seasons. Here's the breakdown:

BEYOND THE ARC

- **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, ranks 10th in the A-10 in three-point percentage (36.1) and is tied for ninth in threes made per game (2.1)
- SJU is eighth in the A-10 in team 3-point percentage, hitting 32.5 percent

HELP FROM HOLSTON

- Grad transfer **Troy Holston** had his second double-figure game at SJU when he scored 13 points at La Salle
- His previous SJU high was 11 points in the win over Davidson

LUCKY CLOVER

- **Chris Clover** matched his career-high at Dayton, scoring 21 points for the fourth time in his career. He shot 6-for-11 from the field and made 3-of-5 three-pointers
- He contributed 15 points in the win over Saint Louis and 17 at Davidson, and then followed that with a team-high 19 at UMass
- The senior is averaging 12.7 ppg as a starter in the last 14 games

CHARLES IN CHARGE

- **Charlie Brown** had the game you'd expect from the A-10's leading scorer to key the comeback win over Richmond. He finished with 31 points and a career-high 14 rebounds for the first double-double of his career
- In the second half, he connected on 6-of-9 from the field, and 3-of-4 three-pointers
- That performance came after Brown scored just nine points at Saint Louis, which was his first time without double figures since Jan. 7, 2017 against Fordham (0 points)
- Brown then notched his second straight double-double with 27 points and 12 rebounds in the loss to Penn
- The redshirt sophomore tallied 28 points in the win over Saint Louis and 20 at Davidson and at Fordham
- He now has 14 career games with 20-plus points and two with 30-plus points

STARTING OUT

- **Lorenzo Edwards** made the first start of his career in place of **Taylor Funk** at Dayton, which ended Funk's streak of 42 consecutive games started, and has since started the past 10 contests
- **Markell Lodge** started five in a row for **Anthony Longpré** (concussion protocol) until Lodge was sidelined, and he was replaced by Funk
- With the injuries to **Lamarr Kimble** and **Pierfrancesco Oliva**, and then Longpré and Lodge, the Hawks had only seven full scholarship players available to play during an eight-game stretch from Jan. 15 to Feb. 15

HEAVY HEARTS

- Coach **Phil Martelli** lost his father - Phil "Pops" Martelli - on Feb. 6. Mr. Martelli, 87, was a fixture at practices, games and road trips over the past 24 years until health issues limited his travel two years ago
- The last game he attended was SJU's win over UMass on Feb. 2
- Prior to the win over Saint Louis, Saint Joseph's held a pre-game tribute to "Pops" and the players and staffs from both teams embraced the Hawks' head coach one by one
- "That tribute . . . the class that went into that, the thought . . . I'm not big into faking it. One of the first texts that I got came from (SLU coach) Travis Ford. And when I got to the office, there was a beautiful floral arrangement from Saint Louis. And for those kids to come over, even at the end, to acknowledge my loss and my family, much respect. Much respect to the Atlantic 10 and much respect to Saint Louis," said Martelli

CLOVER IN THE CLUTCH

- Senior **Chris Clover** had his best game of the year when the Hawks needed it, helping the win over Davidson on Jan. 15
- Starting in place of the injured **Lamarr Kimble**, Clover scored a season-high 18 points while hitting a personal best four three-pointers, including the eventual game winner with 59 seconds to play
- Clover had a career-high 10 rebounds in the win over Richmond and the posted 14 points and eight rebounds vs. Penn

THE INJURY PLAGUE

- Saint Joseph's has certainly faced its share of significant injuries in three consecutive years (see above), adding this year's injuries to **Pierfrancesco Oliva**, **Lamarr Kimble** and **Markell Lodge**
- Oliva and Lodge are out for the rest of the season but Kimble returned on Feb. 23 after missing 10 games with a fracture in his right hand

A SELECT GROUP

Phil Martelli is a member of a select group, as one of eight active D-1 head coaches who have 400+ wins and have only coached at one school. Here's the list:

- Oliva dislocated his left knee on Jan. 12 and underwent surgery for ligament damage
- **Anthony Longpré** missed six games after suffering a concussion at Saint Louis but returned to the court on Feb. 12
- Lodge had surgery and is out for the rest of the year after tearing a ligament in his right thumb in the win over Saint Louis
- In 2017-18, Kimble (foot) and **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, (wrist) were lost for the year. Kimble played in only the season opener and Brown was sidelined in the preseason
- The 2016-17 season saw four players miss time with injuries - Shavar Newkirk (19 gms), Oliva (entire season), **Lorenzo Edwards** (all but one game) and Kimble (7 gms)

BYTES ON BYNUM

- **Jared Bynum** has been impressive in his first year and is averaging 11.4 points and leading the team in assists with 4.6
- **Phil Martelli** said, "He might be a freshman academically and socially, but he's a basketball player. He belongs in these games."
- Bynum, who has scored double figures 18 times, had a career-high eight assists at Duquesne and bettered that with nine assists vs. Davidson
- He had a team-high 18 points, as well as six rebounds and eight assists, at Saint Louis
- Bynum notched his second 20-point game of the year with 20 in the win over Saint Louis, hitting a season-best 8-of-13 field goals
- In the overtime loss to Rhode Island, he had 19 points and seven assists while hitting 6-of-9 field goals and 3-of-4 three-point attempts

ON THE REBOUND

- SJU dominated the boards against Richmond and Penn, outrebounding their foes by 91-59. The Hawks registered a season-high 47 boards vs. Penn
- In the Richmond win, **Charlie Brown** and **Chris Clover** each recorded personal bests with 14 and 10 rebounds, respectively. Clover grabbed 10 at Davidson, to go along with 17 points, to notch his first career double-double

OUT OF THE FUNK

- **Taylor Funk** came up with big plays against Richmond as he hit the tying three-pointer with 34.3 seconds to go. The sophomore also blocked a UR shot with 9.5 seconds left
- Funk connected on 4-of-9 three-pointers in the game, the most since he had four against UIC on Nov. 28
- He has struggled from the perimeter, and in the six games prior to Richmond, was a combined 5-for-35 from three-point range
- Funk came off the bench in four games and hit for 11 points at Dayton, connecting on three three-pointers
- He returned to the starting lineup vs. St. Bonaventure on Feb. 12 in place of the injured **Markell Lodge**, starting four straight before coming off the bench vs. La Salle on March 2

LOOK AT LORENZO

- **Phil Martelli** stated in the preseason that redshirt sophomore **Lorenzo Edwards** was one player who had made the biggest strides over the summer
- Edwards gave a glimpse of that improvement as he scored 11 points in 15 minutes vs. Monmouth, making 5-of-7 from the field
- He missed three games with a shoulder injury but has seen action in 25 games and is averaging 16.2 minutes per game
- In his second start, he scored a career-high 14 points as the Hawks defeated UMass. He then bettered that with 22 points on 8-of-9 shooting at La Salle
- Edwards has started the 10 nine games and is averaging 10.8 points in this stretch

LODGE IN THE LINEUP

- **Markell Lodge** made his first start of the year when he filled in for **Anthony Longpré** vs. Richmond. It was his first since he started all 31 games in 2016-17
- Lodge had seven points and four rebounds in 22 minutes against the Spiders
- The redshirt senior started five straight and saw a career-high 33 minutes at Dayton before suffering a season-ending thumb injury against Saint Louis (Feb. 8)

NEXT MAN UP

- With the Hawks facing the absence of two key players, **Phil Martelli** didn't buy into the "next man up" theory, but it certainly seemed like the players did against Davidson (Jan. 15)
- Senior **Chris Clover** started in place of **Lamarr Kimble** and had his best game of the year with a season-high 18 points
- Graduate transfer **Troy Holston** had his first double-figure game with the Hawks, contributing 11 points, with three three-pointers, in a season-high 21 minutes

ON BOARD

- **Charlie Brown** leads the Hawks in rebounding with 5.8 in overall games and 6.0 in A-10 contests. **Taylor Funk** is averaging 5.8 in league games
- **Pierfrancesco Oliva** had been the Hawks' top rebounder for the first part of the season as he had double-figure rebounds four times

ON AND OFF SCORING

- After scoring 60 points or less in six straight games, the Hawks' offense got back to normal and tallied 84 in the loss at Duquesne
- But they slipped back into sub-70 mode vs. Davidson (61) and Saint Louis (57), giving them under 62 points in eight straight games
- SJU is averaging 66.8 ppg in A-10 games and shooting 39.0 percent from the field and 31.3 percent from three-point range

GAME OF RUNS

- A 23-0 run by Saint Louis doomed the Hawks on Jan. 18. SJU was within 36-35 at 13:05 before the Billikens scored 23 straight points over six minutes to take a 56-35 lead
- The Hawks appeared to be suffering the same fate vs. Richmond as the Spiders ran off 16 straight points in the first half, staking a 21-10 lead. SJU turned things around in the second half to post the 74-70 win
- Other notable scoring droughts:
 - SJU scored 59 points vs. Wagner; went without a FG in the final 4:53 of the game
 - George Mason had a 19-0 run in six minutes during the final 10 minutes of the game
 - GW closed out the game w/ 13 straight and a 16-4 run in the final five minutes
 - St. Bonaventure took a 17-1 lead and had a 39-12 halftime lead (Jan. 9)
 - After a strong start by SJU, Dayton used a 14-0 run over the final 10 minutes of the first half, and then a 13-2 run midway through the second
 - La Salle scored nine straight points early in the game to build up a 10-point lead that the Hawks couldn't overcome
 - St. Bonaventure used back-to-back runs of 8-0 run and then 7-0 as the Hawks scored one point in five minutes (on Feb. 12)
 - Fordham kept SJU scoreless for five minutes in the first half, scoring 13 straight, but the Hawks turned the tables in the second half, using a 23-0 run of their own to pick up the win

TO THE POINT

- After scoring 70-plus points in eight of their first nine games, the Hawks averaged just 54.2 in six games from Dec. 8 to Jan. 9
- The low was 45 points vs. Loyola Chicago but thankfully, the Ramblers scored only 16 points in the first half and finished with 42 in the game, as SJU came away with the win
- The 45 points was SJU's lowest output since it scored 40 against Charlotte (3/9/13)

SLOW START

- SJU's 0-4 start in the A-10 matched the 2010-11 season when the Hawks went 0-8 to begin conference play. That team won four of its last six as it reached the A-10 Semifinals
- SJU has often found success in the latter half of the season. Last year's squad was 4-5 in January but went on to post a 6-3 record in February and eventually reach the A-10 semis

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

- SJU is four in the nation in turnovers per game (9.3) and sixth in fewest number of turnovers (277)
- The Hawks have committed 10-plus turnovers 14 times this season, and in 13 of the last 21 games. The season-high was 14 in the win over Richmond
- Freshman **Jared Bynum** tops the A-10 in assist/turnover ratio with 2.5, with 137 assists this year to just 54 turnovers

DOUBLING DOWN

- **Charlie Brown** has scored double figures in 28 of 30 games played this year, while **Lamarr Kimble** has hit double digits in 18
- Brown missed the Villanova game due to injury, and saw his 33-game double-figure scoring streak end at Saint Louis (9 points)
- Kimble went without double figures against UCF and GW

HANDS OFF

- As they have done the past few seasons, the Hawks have limited their fouls and rank eighth in the nation with fewest fouls (421)
- SJU also ranks ninth in the NCAA in personal fouls per game with 14.5 and has had eight disqualifications this season
- Fouls hurt the Hawks at Davidson, however, as **Charlie Brown** was whistled for his fourth early in the second half. He missed nine minutes and Davidson took the lead during that stretch
- Fouls were also critical in the loss to URI as the Hawks played key minutes without **Chris Clover** and **Charlie Brown**. Clover subsequently picked up his fourth and fifth (technical) with six minutes left in the game and Brown fouled out with :26 left in regulation

TWO SIDES OF THE BALL

- Early on, **Phil Martelli** was concerned about the Hawks' defense, as SJU was giving up 76.8 points per game through the first nine
- That seemed to be rectified as the Hawks allowed an average of 56 points in the three games (Villanova, Loyola, Wagner) leading up to the conference opener
- But that progress suffered a setback as Saint Joseph's saw George Mason score 85 points and more recently, La Salle post 84 points

• On the year, SJU's foes are now averaging 72.2 points per game

SLIPPING AWAY

- The overtime loss to Rhode Island was the sixth double-digit lead lost this year as SJU held its biggest margin (11) with 13 minutes to play in regulation
- At UMass, the Hawks led by 19 at the start of the second half but saw the Minutemen take their only lead of the game with 2.7 seconds to play
- At Davidson, SJU had a 10-point edge with 17:13 left in the game before Davidson turned it around, helped by 10 three-pointers, to record the 80-72 win
- Against GW, SJU had a 12-point lead with 12:41 to go in the first half but saw GW post a big second half en route to the 70-56 win
- Against Temple they led by 11 with 3:29 to play in the first half but suffered the 77-70 loss
- At William & Mary, SJU held a 20-point lead at 18:38 of the second half but saw the Tribe rally to the 87-85 win

DEAN OF COACHES

- **Phil Martelli** is in his 24th season as head coach and is the dean of the Atlantic 10's coaches. He owns an overall record of 443-326 and is SJU's all-time leader in victories
- Martelli owns a 218-175 record in Atlantic 10 play, which ranks second all-time and first among active coaches for conference wins
- His career total of 443 wins is also second all-time (to Temple's John Chaney) and the top number for active coaches in the A-10
- Martelli is one of 25 active D-1 coaches who are their schools' all-time wins leaders

WHAT BROWN CAN DO FOR YOU

- **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, established a new career-high for the third time this year when he poured in 37 points at William & Mary
- He scored 23 in the first half, the highest single-half total of his career, hitting 11-of-17 from the field and 11-of-14 from the foul line
- His 37 points are tied as the seventh highest single-game scoring total in SJU history
- With a 19.0 average, he's aiming to become first Hawk to average 20-plus points in a full season since Jameer Nelson (20.6) in 2003-04. Shavar Newkirk averaged 20.3 ppg in 2016-17, but he played only 12 games after being sidelined with an injury

RECOGNIZING HARD WORK

- **Phil Martelli** announced that walk-ons **Mike Muggeo** and **Toliver Freeman** were both awarded scholarships for the Spring semester
- Muggeo, a 6-3 senior guard, earned a spot on the squad as a walk-on in 2017-18, but was unavailable to play last year due to an injury

• Freeman is a 6-3 guard who joined the Hawks as a walk-on in 2016-17. He has seen action in 13 games during his career, including seven this season

• Freeman played the final two minutes of the home loss to St. Bonaventure and scored a career-high seven points

THE CAPTAIN, THE HERO

- **Lamarr Kimble** hit the game-winner with 0.4 left on the clock to lift Saint Joseph's to a 45-42 win over Loyola Chicago at The Palestra
- It was the team captain's third game-winning shot as a Hawk
- "It wasn't exactly the way we drew it up," said coach **Phil Martelli**. "But he's got a little bit of freedom, because his heart's bigger than his body."

ALL ABOUT ANTHONY

- **Anthony Longpré** connected on three three-pointers for a season-high 10 points against George Mason
- He followed that a career-high 11 rebounds, to go along with eight points, vs. GW, and had a team-high six rebounds at St. Bonaventure
- Longpré had another strong game on the boards at Duquesne, leading the squad with nine as well as nine points
- He missed six straight games with a concussion and returned to the court vs. St. Bonaventure on Feb. 12

FRESH APPROACH

- **Lamarr "Fresh" Kimble** helped the Hawks pull away at Princeton as he poured in 22 second-half points
- The captain made 8-of-12 from the field in the half, and had 10 of 13 points as SJU expanded on a three-point halftime lead, going up by 53-45
- It was the second game in which Kimble had a big second half to help the Hawks to the win; he previously scored 24 of his career-high-tying 31 points vs. UIC in the second half

DEPTH CHARGES

- The Hawks have not gotten much scoring from their bench this season and it has been a factor in 11 of the 17 losses, as SJU's reserves have been outscored, 327-99, in those games.

TAYLOR'S THREE'S

- Sophomore **Taylor Funk** has 134 three-pointers in the 62 games of his career thus far, and reached 100 quicker than any other Hawk. By comparison, all-time leader Langston Galloway made 75 threes in his first 37 games
- Funk set the SJU freshman record last season when he made 84 in 32 games
- He hit a career-best 6-for-7 from beyond the arc in the win over Wake Forest

20/20

- **Charlie Brown, Jr.** has tallied 20-plus points in 13 of 29 games; he has reached 20-plus points 14 times in 60 career games

SHARP SHOOTERS

- The Hawks have shot 50 percent or better in 15 of 60 halves played this year, with a high of 66.7 percent in the loss at UMass
- SJU converted more than 50 percent in both halves at Princeton, making 55.0 percent in the game

END TO END

- The win at Princeton was the only game this season that the Hawks held the lead from start to finish. There were two ties, but SJU never let the Tigers forge ahead

30 FOR 30

- SJU received individual 30-point efforts in three consecutive games, as **Lamarr Kimble** netted 31 vs. West Virginia and UIC while **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, had at 37 points at William & Mary
- Brown added another to the list when he scored 31 against Richmond

CHECK IT OUT

- The Hawks are missing the rebounding and passing ability of **Pierfrancesco "Checco" Oliva**, who was the team's top rebounder before his season-ending injury
- **Phil Martelli** said that although he doesn't like labels, "Oliva is the epitome of a point-forward"

PRODUCTIVE 20 MINUTES

- **Lamarr Kimble's** 22-point second half at Princeton was his second 20-plus point half of the year, and the third highest of the season
- Kimble had 24 points in the second half against UIC which is highest single-half total for a Hawk this season. **Charlie Brown** scored 23 of his 37 points vs. William & Mary in the first half
- More recently, Brown scored 23 in the second half to finish with 31 in the win over Richmond and had 21 in the first half of the 91-61 win over Saint Louis

CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

- Redshirt junior **Lamarr "Fresh" Kimble** was voted team captain for the third consecutive season, becoming the only player in SJU history to serve as captain for three years
- As a sophomore, Kimble became just the third player in Hawk history to be named a captain in his second season
- Kimble's leadership is appreciated by **Phil Martelli**: "I'm glad he's on my team and I'm glad he's in my program because whatever I need . . . He's in charge of that locker room... Fresh is just legit. He's one of those guys that embraces being a Philadelphian and playing in Philadelphia.... I'm a big Fresh fan, forget the basketball. He is the epitome of a captain."

SITTING AND WAITING

- Junior **Ryan Daly** is sitting out the year after transferring from Delaware, and will have two years with the Hawks
- A native of nearby Ardmore, Pa., Daly scored 1,000 points in two seasons at Delaware and earned All-CAA honors twice
- SJU connections run in his family as both of his parents are alums and his late grandfather, Jim Boyle, was the Hawks' head coach from 1981 to 1990. His first cousin is Thomas Boyle, the Hawks' director of operations

SEEING RED

- SJU's roster is dotted with five players who have redshirted at least one season while on Hawk Hill. Although that number seems unusually high, it is actually tied for the fifth most in the nation. Four schools (CSU Bakersfield, Rider, UCF, Saint Mary's) lead with nine each while four schools have eight red-shirts on their active rosters
- Saint Joseph's redshirts are:
 - **Charlie Brown, Jr.** (R-So.) - missed the 2017-18 season with shoulder injury
 - **Lorenzo Edwards** (R-So.) - had shoulder surgery during this freshman year
 - **Lamarr Kimble** (R-Jr.) - reinjured his foot in the first game of 2017-18 and underwent surgery, missing all but one game
 - **Markell Lodge** (R-Sr.) - redshirted his first year to concentrate on academics
 - **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (R-Jr.) - sat out his sophomore season after having surgery to correct a chronic knee condition

FROM THE START

- **Jared Bynum** became the sixth freshman in six years to be in the Hawks' starting lineup on opening day
- Previous freshman starters for SJU were: **Anthony Longpré** (2017-18), **Charlie Brown** (2016-17), **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (2015-16), James Demery (2014-15) and current Atlanta Hawk DeAndre' Bemby (2013-14)

WISE BEYOND THEIR YEARS

- **Phil Martelli** commented that the Hawks are an "older" team this year with five players who have redshirted previous seasons and one graduate student (**Troy Holston**)
- **Markell Lodge** and Holston are 24, and **Charlie Brown, Pierfrancesco Oliva** and **Lamarr Kimble** are each 22 years old
- The following are the Hawks' "redshirts" with their respective seasons on campus:
 - **Markell Lodge** (5th)
 - **Pierfrancesco Oliva** (4th)
 - **Lamarr Kimble** (4th)
 - **Lorenzo Edwards** (3rd)
 - **Charlie Brown** (3rd)
- Holston is in his first season at SJU after transferring from South Florida. He played two seasons with the Bulls while battling knee injuries

PICKING THE HAWKS

- Saint Joseph's was picked second in the A-10 Preseason Poll, which is the highest for the Hawks since 2012-13, when they were first
- Last year's squad was picked third in the poll, and despite two key injuries, finished fourth in the league and reached the semifinals while posting a 16-16 overall record
- **Lamarr Kimble** and **Charlie Brown, Jr.**, were each named to the 2018-19 Atlantic 10 Preseason All-Conference Third Team

STRONG FINISH

- Despite facing its second straight season with key injuries in 2017-18, the Hawks came on strong at the end of the year and finished with a 16-16 record
- SJU closed out the regular season winning three straight and six of its last seven to finish in fourth place with a 10-8 record
- The Hawks defeated George Mason in the A-10 Quarterfinals but were edged by top-seeded Rhode Island, 90-87, in the semifinals

CRADLE OF COACHES

- The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of seven SJU graduates have gone on to become head coaches in the NBA, and SJU is tied with Illinois for second on the list of universities with alums that have served as NBA head coaches. Indiana tops the list with 11 graduates.

FUTURE HAWKS

- Saint Joseph's signed two standouts to national letters of intent during the early signing period – Hakim Hart and Kenan Sarvan
- Hart, a 6-5, 190-pound, swingman from Roman Catholic High School in Philadelphia, averaged 15.1 points per game last season and earned All-Catholic League honors. He helped Roman win the 2018 Philadelphia Catholic League championship and the 2018 PIAA 6A State Championship. He was named to the 2019 All-Catholic League First Team
- Hart recently led his team to its second straight Catholic League title while earning PCL First Team honors for the second time
- Sarvan is a 6-9, 220-pound forward originally from Holland and currently attending Bishop Sullivan Catholic High School in Virginia Beach. As a junior, he averaged 14.6 points and 7.8 rebounds for the Crusaders

HOME AT HAGAN

- This marks the 10th season of the Hawks' home, Hagan Arena, after Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse underwent a renovation and expansion in 2008-09
- SJU is 90-47 at Hagan but owns an all-time record of 409-129 in 68 years on campus
- The Hawks went 10-3 at home in 2017-18 and are 10-5 this year (including two games at the Palestra)

HONORING THE COACH

- The Hawks are wearing a patch on their uniforms with "McK" to honor former coach Jack McKinney, who passed away in September
- McKinney was head coach at Saint Joseph's for eight seasons, from 1966 to 1974. He compiled a 144-77 record and owns the third best all-time winning percentage (65.2 pct) among SJU coaches
- McKinney took the Hawks to postseason play five times in his eight years, which included four NCAA Tournament appearances
- He went on to coach in the NBA, although a serious accident cut short his season with the Lakers in 1979. He rebounded to earn NBA Coach of the Year honors with the Indiana Pacers in 1981

BACK TO BROOKLYN

- The Hawks are happy about the return to the Barclays Center for the A-10 Championship as the arena has been good to them in the past. Saint Joseph's last two Atlantic 10 titles have been won on that court, in 2014 and 2016

HAWKS IN THE NBA

- Saint Joseph's is represented in the NBA by two players:
- Langston Galloway (Pistons) - was undrafted in 2014 but made the Knicks' squad as a free agent; played for the Pelicans and Kings before joining the Pistons in 2017-18
- DeAndre' Bembry (Hawks) - 21st overall draft pick in 2016 by Atlanta, who was the 33rd SJU player to be drafted, and the sixth to be taken in the first round
- SJU also has three alums who are currently assistant coaches with the Philadelphia 76ers - Jim O'Brien ('74), John Bryant ('05) and Dwayne Jones ('05)

LOOKING AHEAD

- The 2019 Atlantic 10 Championship begins at the Barclays Center with opening round games on March 13 and running through March 17

PHIL MARTELLI

Head Coach

24th Season - 443-326

With the 2018-19 season marking his 24th as the head basketball coach at Saint Joseph's, **Phil Martelli** has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, a perennial postseason participant and a key player on the national scene. In doing so, he has earned his place among the top coaches in the school's storied history and is one of the more respected coaches in the game.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 443-326. Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories nine times in his 23 previous seasons, which is the most for any Hawks' coach. His record of 218-175 in Atlantic 10 play is the most conference wins for any active coach and ranks second all-time in the league.

Martelli Highlights:

- He has taken SJU to the postseason in four of the last seven years, and 13 times in the 23 seasons previous to this one, while winning three Atlantic 10 Championships (1997, 2014, 2016)
- Martelli's 18 postseason wins (7 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in school history
- Despite injuries to two key players, his 2017-18 squad won seven of its last nine games, to finish fourth in the Atlantic 10 and reach the conference semifinals
- His 2015-16 team compiled a 28-8 record for the second-most victories for a Hawk team, won its second Atlantic 10 title in three seasons and advanced to the NCAA Second Round for the first time since 2004
- Four of his players have been named the Atlantic 10 Player of the Year, with the most recent being DeAndre' Bemby in 2015-16
- In 2013-14, his veteran team turned in one of the more memorable seasons in school history, adding another A-10 Championship to his résumé as SJU went 24-10 and reached the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time under Martelli, falling to eventual national champion Connecticut in overtime
- Seven players have reached the NBA, including first round draft picks DeAndre' Bemby (2016), Jameer Nelson (2004) and Delonte West (2004) and a second-round selection, Ahmad Nivins (2009). Dwayne Jones and Ronald Roberts, Jr. had NBA stints while undrafted free agent Langston Galloway earned All-Rookie Second Team honors with the New York Knicks in 2015. Galloway (Detroit) and Bemby (Atlanta) are currently playing in the NBA
- In 2003-04, he guided a squad that became the most compelling story in college basketball - the Hawks went undefeated in the regular season, were the top-ranked team in the nation and earned the school's first-ever number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the Elite Eight
- Joined with Jameer Nelson to sweep the National Coach and Player of the Year awards in 2004, marking one of the few times in history that the top player and coach were from the same school
- Current member of the NCAA Division I Basketball Oversight Committee; previously served the game as a Past President of the NABC's Board of Directors, and the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Ethics Coalition
- Is very involved with Coaches vs. Cancer, is the past chair of the National Council, and the co-chair of the Philadelphia chapter, which is one of the largest fundraising groups in this effort in the nation
- Was the co-recipient of the Circle of Honor Award given by the American Cancer Society in 2017, honored along with Temple's Fran Dunphy
- Has spent a total of 34 years with the Hawks' program, serving as an assistant coach for 10 years prior to attaining the top job in July, 1995

THE HAWK

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Saint Joseph's Hawk is in its 63rd year in 2018-19.

The Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die."

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season.

In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant motion, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" A few years ago, ESPN used a "flap-o-meter" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game, and the student who holds the position gains a tuition scholarship. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also serves as a team manager for the men's basketball team and travels with the squad.

Domenic Godshall is serving as the Saint Joseph's University Hawk mascot for the 2018-19 season, becoming the 39th student to represent the University in this role. He is a senior sports marketing major from Lititz, Pa.



ON THE AIR

TV/VIDEO: Saint Joseph's fans will be able to watch all 31 men's basketball regular-season games either on television or through digital media. A total of 21 Hawks' games this season will be televised nationally while 10 will be streamed digitally. Nine games will appear on the subscription-based ESPN+.

RADIO: All 31 Saint Joseph's men's basketball regular-season games will be broadcast on radio, with Talk Radio 1210 WPHT airing the majority of games. It marks the second consecutive year of a partnership with the station. The Saint Joseph's Sports Network team of Matt Martucci and Lunardi will return for their 10th season together, with Lunardi marking his 29th year as the Hawks' color analyst. Also calling play-by-play on selected games for the second straight year is Pat McCarthy. (Schedule on pg. 2)

INTERNET: Information for Saint Joseph's basketball is found at SJU's athletics website, www.SJUHawks.com with statistics, updated game notes, and live in-game statistics for all Hawk home games, and selected road games. Through Hawks All-Access, fans can follow every home game through audio streaming, along with video features and highlights.

PHIL MARTELLI'S HAWKTALK RADIO SHOW: Phil Martelli's "HawkTalk" Radio Show takes place on Monday's from 7 to 8 p.m. beginning on January 7, and through March 11 (exception Jan. 28) with the broadcast live from JD McGillicuddy's in Havertown, Pa. Live streaming audio is on SJUHawks.com while the show will also be podcast on Talk Radio 1210's website for listening anytime.

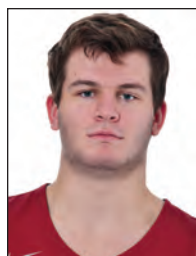
