**2003-04 season averages:** 18.9 points; 5.4 rebounds, 4.7 assists; 1.7 steals

**Career:** Second leading scorer for Saint Joseph's team which went 30-2, posted a perfect regular season (27-0), reached the top of the national rankings and earned the school's first-ever #1 seed in the NCAA Tournament on its way the Elite 8... Has 1,235 career points, ranking him 25th on the all-time list.

**2003-04:** Honorable Mention All-America by Associated Press... *Basketball Times* All-America 1st Team... Atlantic 10 All-Conference 1st Team honoree... Joined with Jameer Nelson to give the Hawks the best backcourt in the nation... Ranked second on the team in points (18.9 avg), rebounding (5.4) and assists (4.7)... Scored double figures in all but one game, and 20-plus points 16 times... Became 42nd player in SJU history to surpass 1,000 career points... Set a school record with 37 consecutive free throws, bettering the mark of 27 he had set earlier in the season... Ranked eighth in the nation in free throw percentage (.892)... Had a perfect game at Xavier - hitting for a career-high 33 pts on 12-for-12 FG; 3-for-3 3-pt FG; and 6-for-6 FT... Extended his shooting streak to 19 consecutive baskets, before streak came to an end vs. UMass... Scored 19 points at URI, including game-winner with 50 seconds left... Netted 15 of his 23 points in the second half at UMass... Had game-high of 24 vs. Dayton... Tallied 21 points with six 3-pointers at Temple... Named the national Player of the Week (Jan. 19) by The Sporting News, and ESPN.com... All-Big 5 1st Team selection... Earned the Cy Kastleman Award as the most accurate foul shooter in the Big 5... Four-time Atlantic 10 Player of the Week and Big 5 Player of the Week once... Shared the John P. Hilferty Award as the Hawks' MVP with Jameer Nelson.

**2002-03:** Atlantic 10 All-Conference 1st Team and Philadelphia Big 5 selection... Named Most Improved Player by both leagues... All-District 1st Team by the USBWA and second team by the NABC... Team's leading scorer before a stress fracture of the right fibula hobbled him for the final eight games of the season... Missed three of the final eight contests, and played sparingly in the others, including A-10 and NCAA Tournament games... One of hottest players in the country prior to injury, averaging 28.5 points and shooting 56.7 percent from the field over a four-game stretch... Finished year second on team in scoring (17.3), assists (83), steals (41) and 3-point percentage (.374), and third on team in rebounding (4.3 rpg.) and 3-pointers made (55)... Tied for league lead in scoring in conference games only (21.1 ppg.)... Scored in double figures in 23 of 26 games, leading team in scoring 12 times... Tallied career high 32 points in win over Temple... Named Big 5 Player of the Week four times, A-10 Player of the Week twice.

**2001-02:** Played in all 31 games as key reserve... Leading scorer off the bench, averaging 5.9 points and 3.0 rebounds... His 17.0 minutes per game were most by a non-starter... Tallied double figures in scoring five times.

**High School/Personal:** 2001 Metro Player of the Year by the *Washington Post*... Born July 26, 1983.
