HAWK HEADLINES

• Saint Joseph's is making its first-ever appearance in the NCAA Field Hockey Championship on Saturday morning. The Hawks punched their ticket to the tournament with a 3-2 double-overtime win over Massachusetts in the Atlantic 10 Championship on November 4.

• The title is the second in program history; the Hawks last claimed the A-10 crown in 1995, when the conference did not have an automatic bid to the NCAA Championship.

• SJU is the two-time reigning Atlantic 10 regular season champion; the Hawks had previously won the regular season title in 1995.

• The Hawks have won nine in a row and 15 of their last 16 en route to a program record 18 victories this season.

• Saturday's game will be the first meeting between the Hawks and Tar Heels. Should Saint Joseph's advance, the Hawks will meet either Princeton or Virginia; SJU and Princeton have never met, while Virginia enjoys a 5-1 all-time series lead.

WELCOME TO THE PARTY: Saint Joseph's is making its first-ever appearance in the NCAA Field Hockey Championship in 2017. The Hawks earned the Atlantic 10's automatic berth in the Championship with a 3-2 double-overtime win over Massachusetts on November 4. The Hawks previously claimed the Atlantic 10 tournament title in 1995, but the league did not have an automatic berth that season.

THE HAWK WILL NEVER DIE: All four teams in Charlottesville for the First and Second Rounds of the NCAA Championship are ranked in the top 15 of the Penn Monto/National Field Hockey Coaches Association Poll, but the Hawks surely won't be intimidated. Saint Joseph's has racked up a 3-2 record against ranked teams this season while posting their own 14-1 record since breaking into the poll themselves.

CHAMPIONS: The Hawks earned their first Atlantic 10 title in 22 years with a thrilling 3-2 double-overtime win over Massachusetts in the Atlantic 10 championship game on November 4. Emily Peters tipped home a ball from Anna Willocks with just under six minutes to go in the second extra session to send the Hawks to their first-ever NCAA Field Hockey Championship. Peters was named the Most Outstanding Player of the Championship and was joined on the All-Championship Team by Willocks, Quinn Maguire, and Jordan Oleginski.

BACK-TO-BACK: Saint Joseph's finished conference play with a 7-1 league mark, good for the program's second consecutive Atlantic 10 regular season crown and third overall (1995). The last time a team not from Massachusetts or Richmond won consecutive A-10 regular season titles was 1989 and 1990, when Penn State finished atop the league in its second and third year of sponsoring field hockey.

SERIOUS HARDWARE: Saint Joseph's claimed a share of all four Atlantic 10 individual awards that were handed out by the league on November 2. Anna Willocks made history as the league's first-ever three-time Offensive Player of the Year, while Lynn Farquhar won her second Coach of the Year honor. Victoria Kammerinke was tabbed the Co-Defensive Player of the Year, while Quinn Maguire is the third Hawk in as many years to be named Rookie of the Year (Willocks, 2015; Pepa Serrano, 2016). SJU also placed eight on the league's All-Conference teams (see inset for full list).

COMEBACK KIDS: The Hawks' run to the A-10 title was almost derailed right after it began, as Saint Joseph's found itself down 2-0 to Richmond just 16 minutes into the semi-final matchup between the two teams. Anna Willocks netted a pair of goals to get the Hawks level before halftime, and a five-goal second-half onslaught carried SJU to a 7-2 win. It was the second time in 15 days that the Hawks had hung a five-spot on the board in the second half in Am-

herst; on October 20, SJU fell behind early to UMass by the same 2-0 score before earning a 5-2 win. For the season, the Hawks have posted seven come-from-behind wins.

SECOND-HALF SURGES: Even when they don't fall behind, the Hawks turn on the offense in the second half. Saint Joseph's has outscored its opposition 41-13 in the second half of games this season.

HELPING HAND: When Emily Peters tipped in the championship-winning goal on November 4, it not only led the Hawks to an Atlantic 10 title, it also gave Anna Willocks the program's all-time assist record. It was the 27th helper of the junior's stellar career, breaking a tie with Dani Bleam '96 and Nicole Antonini '07.

WON FOR THE RECORD BOOKS: The Hawks set a new program record for wins in a season on November 3 when they posted their 17th victory of the season. That eclipsed the old mark set by the 1995 squad that turned in a 16-6 mark en route to the Atlantic 10 championship. The Hawks then extended that mark to 18 the following day.

LYNN FOR THE WIN(S): Head coach Lynn Farquhar moved into second place on the program's all-time wins list when the Hawks topped the defending national champions, eighth-ranked Delaware, 2-1 on October 14. She earned her 50th career win on November 3 when the Hawks topped Richmond, 7-2, in the Atlantic 10 semifinals.

#QUINNING: Quinn Maguire has made quite an impact in her first season on Hawk Hill. The Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Year is tied for the team lead with 18 goals on the season, and has notched a pair of hat tricks (at La Salle on October 13, vs. Richmond on November 3). She was named Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week six times, and with 42 points on the season, she has set new program highs for goals and points by a freshman.

CAPTAIN AMERICA: In addition to her duties with the Hawks, assistant coach Hannah Prince is the captain of the United States Women's National Indoor Team. Prince and her squad recently won the Pan American Indoor Cup, going undefeated in the process, and qualified for the 2018 Indoor World Cup in Berlin.

THE VICTOR, VICTORIA: Goalkeeper Victoria Kammerinke set a new program record for wins in a season when she notched her 16th victory on October 28. Kammerinke now has 28 career victories, ranking her third in program history. She is also among the nation's leaders in save percentage with an impressive .808 mark.

YOUTH MOVEMENT: The Hawks have made steady progress over the course of Lynn Farquhar's tenure, but the team has actually gotten younger and younger along the way, culminating in an outstanding season from SJU's current freshman class that has seen the rookies score 43 of the Hawks' program-record 70 goals this season (61.4%). The Hawks have only one senior and three juniors on the roster, and coupled with a sophomore class boasting three Atlantic 10 All-Conference First Team honorees, SJU is poised to contend for the league title for years to come.
